This October, Calvary will consider stewardship around the theme, "*A Place at the Table: The Grace of Extravagant Giving*." At the heart of this series is the reminder that God has invited everyone to His table through Jesus Christ. When we bring what we have – our time, talents, and treasure – God multiplies it more than we can ask or imagine.

The Table that Jesus set is a place of grace. **The Table** is where we encounter Jesus' love, where we are bound together as His people, and where we make room for others to join us. Our stewardship series will invite us into holy conversations about generosity as we explore our church's Vision of *Loving Jesus*, *Loving Neighbor*, and *Building Community*.

Week 1: World Communion Sunday, October 5th

"Bringing It to the Table: Loving Jesus" – Matthew 6:19–21

World Communion Sunday is a day of unity for Christians. We remember that what we bring to the Lord's table reveals where our hearts are. Loving Jesus means trusting Him with our time, talents, and treasure.

ADVENT DEVOTIONAL WRITING INVITATION

This Advent and Christmas, our worship will focus on the original Songs of Christmas found in Luke's Gospel: Elizabeth's *Ave Maria*, Mary's *Magnificat*, Zechariah's *Benedictus*, the angels' *Gloria*, and Simeon's *Nunc Dimittis*. Each song overflows with hope, peace, joy, love, and the blessings of God's promise fulfilled.

For our annual Advent Devotional, we invite you to write a short daily entry (125-200 words) inspired by any Christmas song – whether one of Luke's originals, a beloved carol, or even a meaningful secular favorite. Maybe “*O Holy Night*” stirs your soul, “*Joy to the World*” fills you with praise, or “*I'll Be Home for Christmas*” brings memories of love and belonging. Your reflection could explore what the song means to you, connect it to scripture, share a personal story, or offer a prayer for the season.

Whether you write poetry or prose, a testimony or a reflection, your voice will help our congregation sing the story of Christmas as a beloved community.

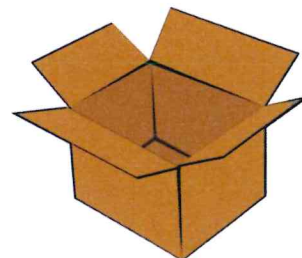

RECYCLING AT CALVARY

If you ever place recyclable items in our Recycling Dumpster, please be sure to read this notice:

Reminder! NO plastic bags may be placed in Calvary's Recycling Dumpster. There are fines from the recycling site where our trash haulers deliver our recyclables which our hauler will pass on to the church if plastic bags are in the container. There are cameras on the trucks to monitor what is in our container and we will be fined \$165 if there are plastic bags, even just one.

If you are taking recyclables out to the dumpster you must place the items so that they are loose in the dumpster and not within a plastic bag. Allowable recyclables are: newspaper, cardboard (boxes must be broken down), glass jars or bottles, aluminum & tin cans, hard plastic bottles, jugs & jars (#'s 1, 2 or 5 only). 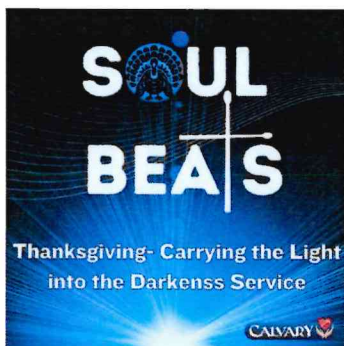
SOUL BEATS
