This fall, the Monday Evening Calvary Book Study Group will be reading and discussing 1 Corinthians -- Searching



Young at Heart Club



"The Pack: Fasting and Forgiveness" Series: Pathway of Prayer Pastor Deborah Port

Scripture Focus: "Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we have also forgiven our debtors." (Matthew 6:11-12)

Background: The Gospel of Matthew was written for a Jewish audience to demonstrate that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. Jesus is portrayed as the divine Son and perfect image of God the Father throughout the Gospel. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus centers His teaching on righteousness not as public performance, but as an authentic relationship with God. Prayer, along with fasting and almsgiving, formed one of the core expressions of Jewish piety. Jesus redefines these practices as the fruit of an authentic relationship with God. When Jesus taught the Lord's Prayer, He offered not only words to recite, but a transformative way of relating to God: intimately, confidently, and with childlike trust. It is a prayer both personal and corporate: we address God not as "my Father" but "our Father," reminding us that life with God is always life shared in community.

Sermon Idea: The Pathway of Prayer begins with *The Plan*: trusting Our Father and listening for His voice. Next, it moves to *The Trailhead* as we look for the first "white blaze:" God's holiness and our alignment to His mission. Next, we consider the essentials we carry with us: *The Pack*. "*Give us this day our daily bread*" teaches us to be present in the moment, name and understand our needs, and trust God's ongoing provision. Martin Luther wrote that this petition, "includes everything that belongs to our entire life in this world." "*Forgive us our debts...*" offers the opportunity for confession and release. Wesley taught that forgiveness was not a passive feeling, but a holy habit of the heart." Fasting- whether from food, media, or noise- intentionally creates space for realignment and renewal. It lightens our "spiritual pack" and affirms that God provides for both our daily and eternal needs.

The Pack: Clarifying what is important

Packing what we need and not packing what we don't need: "Give us this day our daily bread"

Stay on the Path: "Forgive us our debts, as we have also forgiven our debtors"

This Week: Try fasting and continue your 5 minutes of silence before prayer. Then practice contemplating only these phrases of The Lord's Prayer." 'Our Father in heaven/hallowed be your name/your kingdom come/your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we have also forgiven our debtors." Let God speak next and write what you hear in a listening journal.
