Martin Luther taught we are to daily renew our baptism.


We rise and say, "I am baptized into Christ."

Secondary Student Scholarships

Since 2004, Family of Christ members and friends have sponsored 415 Usokami secondary students. Providing scholarship support for these students is a great investment toward a brighter future for them, their community, Tanzania, and Africa. FOC sponsored students will be attending Lutheran private schools. The 2026 FOC scholarship goal is again to raise \$8400. The cost of room, board and education for an entire year is \$615. Any size donation will help reach the \$8400 financial goal.

Medical Scholarship

The Tanzania Medical Scholarship team is sponsoring two medical students:

- Justice Bwisco who is in his 4th year of radiography training at Makerere University in Uganda and will return to the Ilula Hospital after completion of his studies.
- Magreth Mgeyekwa starting a Bachelor of Science in Midwifery.

To help support these medical scholarships, a craft sale will be held after church on Tanzania Sunday, October 5. Stop by and purchase some of our unique, one-of-a-kind craft items. The Medical Scholarship team will also participate in other area craft fairs.

Iringa Hope Micro-Finance Project

In 2019 We began to partner with Iringa Hope, an organization that raises funds and administrates microfinance loans. **Iringa Hope** uses a unique model to

deliver agricultural financing, marketing, and training to smallholder farmers in Tanzania. The organization develops self-governed and self-sustaining member owned and operated cooperative societies that help to alleviate poverty and empower entrepreneurs. Microfinance loans are made to small businesses and farms with an average loan of \$300. The repayment rate of the loans is 98% so our donations continue to be loaned out year after year.
