Tuesday, September 30th is the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a day set aside to honour the resilience, dignity and strength of Indigenous Survivors and intergenerational Survivors, to acknowledge and accept their experiences at Residential School and to remember the children who never came home.

The National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, at the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg, calls upon us to see each Survivor as a single eagle feather and to show those Survivors the same respect and attention an eagle feather deserves. It also teaches we are all in this together — we are all one, connected. It is vital to work together to achieve reconciliation.

#### The Affirmation of Faith
