### From Pastor Denise

October is looking to be a wonderful month of opportunities for service and learning! Ways to live out our TLC values of Generosity, Empowerment and Relationship.

First, Learning – ways to be empowered to live out our faith in daily life:

• I hope you will join me for the 6-week study on the ELCA's Statement on Faith and Civic Life as we seek to faithfully negotiate the current world and how we can best live out our faith. Please sign-up so I can have a participant guide printed for you.

- Our Book Read on October 11 is one I am really looking forward to. I find the book "What We Remember Will Be Saved" at once devastating because of the realities of war and violence people are fleeing and also inspiring because of the stories of what refugees bring with them in order to keep something of the lives they have lost. This will fit in well with what we learned on God's Work Our Hands Sunday about Global Refuge's work.
- On Sunday October 26 following worship, I invite all families with younger children to join in a conversation about Holy Communion and welcoming your children to receive. We will meet in the Library/couch room.
- Also on October 26 our three-year-olds, 3rd graders and confirmation students will receive their Bibles during worship.

Second, Service – ways to practice generosity and build relationships of faith:

- A new opportunity to help lead worship starts in October. The Worship and Music Team suggested
  inviting folks at worship to volunteer to help lead the Prayers each week. We will begin this the first
  Sunday of October. I will just ask for a couple people to join me up front and help lead prayers. No need
  to sign-up ahead of time. Just volunteer on the day and we will go from there.
- Our **Reading Buddies** begin this month. Our relationship with Lakeview Elementary is making a difference in the lives of children and families in our community.
- I'm so thankful for those who are now volunteering at **All People's food pantry**. If anyone else wants to try it let me know.
- Our Lutheran World Relief quilts will be shipped off this month. Our quilters work diligently all year making quilts that go all over the world making a difference for people in poverty, fleeing war and violence or experiencing natural disasters.
- Our Craft Fair is Oct. 18 with lots of opportunity to connect with our wider community. Sign-ups in the narthex and Sign-up Genius. A shout-out to Patty Rosek-Johnson for all her work organizing this event.
- And of course our participation in the South Milwaukee Trick or Treat time on Oct. 25 from 5 p.m.-7 p.m.,
  a time when we welcome a whole lot of people from the community. I especially like the fact that teens
  feel welcome when they are so often told they are too old for Trick or Treating. We will again offer candle
  lighting in memory of loved ones.

I look forward to practicing generosity, empowerment and relationship building with you in the coming month.

### From Our President

Hello Trinity!

As we embrace the autumn season and witness another transformation of nature, the month of October brings exciting opportunities at TLC as well as a significant commemoration in the life of our church—Reformation Sunday.

This year, I decided to do some research on Martin Luther. It has certainly been interesting and insightful to learn more about him and his accomplishments from more than 500 years ago, which remain quite relevant in today's world.

Martin Luther, a German monk and theologian, became a pivotal figure in religious history when he nailed his Ninety-Five Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg on October 31, 1517. His theses were more than just a critique of certain church practices; they were a call to return to the heart of the Gospel—salvation through faith alone, grace alone, and Scripture alone.

Luther's insistence on translating the Bible into the vernacular made the Word of God accessible to ordinary people for the first time, empowering them to engage with their faith in a personal and profound way. It is interesting to fast-forward to today and reflect on our own faith journeys and the ways in which we can reach the communities around us. Like Luther, how can we find ways to share the story of God's love in a way that resonates with others?

And, no research would be complete without looking at some interesting facts about his life that may surprise you:

Music as a Ministry: Luther was not only a theologian but also a musician. He composed hymns like "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," believing that music was a vital tool for worship and a way to teach doctrine. His love for music enriched Lutheran worship and has had a lasting impact on church liturgy. (Ok, this factoid you probably already knew!)

A Man of Humor: Despite the serious nature of his work, Luther had a keen sense of humor. He often employed wit and satire to critique his opponents and convey his theological points. This approach made his writings more relatable and persuasive to the common people.

A Family Man: Luther married Katharina von Bora, a former nun, in 1525. Together, they had six children. Luther's letters and reflections often reveal his deep affection for his family and the joy he found in their company.

A Man of Deep Conviction: Luther's bold stand at the Diet of Worms in 1521, where he famously declared, "Here I stand, I can do no other," exemplifies his unwavering commitment to his beliefs, even in the face of great personal risk.

As we prepare to observe Reformation Sunday, let us be inspired by Martin Luther's courage and dedication. Let us also celebrate the rich heritage of our Lutheran tradition and the vibrant community we share here at Trinity.

May this season of reflection and renewal bring you peace and joy.

### Civic Life and Faith Study

A 6-week Study on Civic Life and Faith led by Pastor Denise will begin **October 8**, **2025** and be held on **Wednesdays from 6:30** p.m. to **8** p.m. at Trinity.

At the 2025 Churchwide Assembly, the ELCA adopted a social statement on Faith and Civic Life. Join Pastor Denise for this 6-week study exploring this statement and what it might look like to engage in civic life as a Christian and as a Lutheran. The six sessions are:

- Session 1: "How Is God's Invitation to Discipleship Lived Out in a Democracy?"
- Session 2: "How Do Christians Address Controversial Civic Issues?"
- Session 3: "What Are Lutheran Views on Civic Life?"
- Session 4: "What Are the Objectives of Democracy in the United States?
- Session 5: "What's Faith-based Living Got to Do with Civic Life?"
- Session 6: "How Do We Go in Peace to Love and Serve the Lord in Civic Life?"

The sessions will be a combination of videos and conversation using the participant guides. Participant guides will be provided. Please sign up or let Pastor Denise know you will attend so that we can have a participant guide ready for you.

### Curiosity Walk with the Renewal Team

Participants will then pair up to explore the area and will reconvene at the church around noon to share observations from the walk. If the weather is poor or you prefer not to walk, driving through the area is also an option.

### Milwaukee Calendars Benefit Trinity



### Fall Book Read



With so much in the news about refugees, migration and immigration we will be reading "What We Remember Will Be Saved: A Story of Refugees and the Things They Carry." Join us on **Saturday, October 11, 2025 at 9:30 a.m.** at Castillo's Family Restaurant (5656 S Packard Ave, Ste 21, Cudahy) for breakfast and discussion of this book. Here is the write up found on the jacket cover. There is one copy in the church library. It is available on Amazon and Barnes and Noble.

Eggplant seeds, a lullaby in a vanishing language, an embroidered dress. When people flee their homes, the things they save speak of beauty and suffering and the indomitable human spirit.

In an era of mass migration in which more than 100 million people are displaced comes this lyrical portrait of Syrian and Iraqi refugees and the belongings they carry. What We Remember Will Be Saved is a book of hope, home, and the stories we hold within us when everything else has been lost.

Journalist and scholar Stephanie Saldaña, who lived in Syria before the war, sets out on a journey across nine countries to meet refugees and learn what they salvaged from the ruins when they escaped. Now, in the

narratives of six extraordinary women and men, from Mt. Sinjar to Aleppo to Lesvos to Amsterdam, we discover that the little things matter a great deal. Saldaña introduces us to a woman who saved her city in a dress, a musician who saved his stories in songs, and a couple who rebuilt their destroyed pharmacy even as the city around them fell apart. Together they provide a window into a religiously diverse corner of the Middle East on the edge of unraveling, and the people keeping it alive with their stories.

Born of years of friendship and reporting, What We Remember Will Be Saved is a breathtaking, elegiac odyssey into the heart of the largest refugee crisis in modern history. It reminds us that refugees are storytellers and speakers of vanishing languages, and of how much history can be distilled into a piece of fabric, or eggplant seeds. What we salvage tells our story. What we remember will be saved.

### Highlights from the August 2025 Council Meeting

The Trinity Church Council did not meet in September due to scheduling conflicts and no actionable items.

### **Financial Update for August**

August was a very difficult month, especially after a good report in July, therefore doubling our year-to-date deficit.

- 1. Net income was -\$6,946; Year-To-Date net income is -\$12,712.
- 2. It could have been worse if it wasn't for a five weekend month.
- 3. Compared to last year at this time, we are \$8,000 down in operating gifting.

Even with this tough news, we do want to thank Trinity for the gifting support you do provide to continue our ministries. But we also want to emphasize how important it is to keep your pledge support up to date, as you are able, as our expenses are about the same each month throughout the year. Reminder that our budget goal is to break even for the year, so that means we have 4 months left to recover from our \$12,000 deficit.





### After the Flood: A Night of Help and Hope for Human Concerns

South Milwaukee Human Concerns has helped thousands of families in our community for 52 years. Now we humbly ask for your help in our time of need.

In August, a historic flood devastated our facility, causing almost \$100,000 in losses and cleanup costs. We started serving clients only days after the storm, but the impact is real and lasting. The center suffered monumental and irreplaceable losses on August 9 and 10. Our expansive basement storage area was inundated with water, some of it flowing up from the basement's sewer grates. Among the losses were thousands of pounds of food items; new and donated clothing; school supplies (set to be given away at the start of this school year); countless new toys set aside for our annual Christmas giveaway; wheelchairs, walkers and shower chairs that we lend to the community at no charge; shelving systems; operational equipment and more. It was a massive, painstaking and costly cleanup.
