Answer Key

- 1. Rising persecution is a challenge: churches denied accounts, pastors denied loans, and societal violence where 2.4 million Americans have been killed by other Americans since 1900, exceeding U.S. war deaths.
- 2. Believers are warned to be wary of Al-generated biblical content. The ministry uses Al for production but always 'cleanses' output. Example: an Al Job summary misrepresented the book by focusing only on chapter 1.
- 3. 2 Timothy 4 is Paul's 'swan song' because it is his last letter before martyrdom: 'The time of my departure is at hand' (2 Timothy 4:6).
- 4. Paul worried Timothy was timid and exhorted him to 'stir up the gift of God' (2 Timothy 1:6), to not fear (2 Timothy 1:7), and to be bold and unashamed (2 Timothy 1:8).
- 5. Demas was Paul's coworker and close friend who forsook him: 'Demas has forsaken me, having loved this present world' (2 Timothy 4:10).
- 6. At his first defense, Paul said, 'No one stood with me, but all forsook me' (2 Timothy 4:16). Yet, 'the Lord stood with me and strengthened me' (2 Timothy 4:17).
- 7. James 4:4: 'Friendship with the world is enmity with God.' One cannot love both God and the world system.
- 8. Paul identified Phygelus and Hermogenes as deserters and noted that 'all those in Asia' had turned away from him (2 Timothy 1:15).
- 9. Epaphras, called a 'bondservant of Christ' (Colossians 4:12), labored in prayer and opposed heresy. His faithfulness contrasts Demas's defection.
- 10. Spiritual 'harlotry' is idolatry/unfaithfulness, described in Jeremiah 3:6 and 2 Chronicles 21, where Israel worshiped idols on high hills and under green trees.

- 1. Analyze Paul's final days, contrasting ministry success with personal abandonment.
- 2. Discuss genuine faith versus mere association, using Demas and Epaphras.
- 3. Synthesize 1 John 2:15, James 4:4, and the parable of the sower on 'loving the world.'
- 4. Explain spiritual 'harlotry' in its Old Testament context and link it to James's rebuke.
- 5. Evaluate parallels between early church persecution and modern challenges, including AI.

AI (Artificial Intelligence) Technology used to generate content. Must be carefully

Bondservant Translation for 'slave,' describing complete devotion to Christ

(e.g., Epaphras).

Demas Former coworker of Paul who forsook him due to love for 'this

present world' (2 Timothy 4:10).

Epaphras Faithful coworker of Paul from Colossae; called a 'bondservant

of Christ' (Colossians 4:12).

Harlotry (Spiritual) Spiritual adultery; Israel's idolatry described as harlotry

(Jeremiah 3:6; 2 Chronicles 21).

Heresy (in Colossae) False teaching claiming matter was evil, Christ was an

emanation from God, promoting angel worship.

James 4:4 'Friendship with the world is enmity with God.'

1 John 2:15 'Do not love the world... If anyone loves the world, the love of

the Father is not in him.'

Martyr One who dies for their faith; Paul anticipated martyrdom.

Paul Apostle and author of 13 NT books, described as a 'hero of the

faith.'

Persecution Rising hostility toward Christians; seen in denial of services to

churches/pastors.

Swan Song A person's final act; here referring to Paul's last letter, 2

Timothy.

Timothy Paul's protégé, exhorted to overcome fear and lead boldly.

2 Timothy Paul's final epistle, focusing on his death, abandonment, and

charge to Timothy.
