Update on the Tower

Bartlett Restoration has completed all the masonry on the tower itself. (See attached photos.) The scaffolding remains as the metal work on the tower is progressing with Roof Tile Management (RTM).

Bartlett is overseeing the next two projects. A lifting device will be hired to allow repairs to be done on the louvre on the west side of the church. Following this, repairs will be made to the south wall's foundation.

Work should be done by the end of October and the scaffolding should be removed in November.
