#### PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Like many of you, I was horrified to learn of Charlie Kirk's murder, just as I was to hear of the murder of Speaker Melissa Hortman and her husband. Along with the assassination attempts on President Trump, Governor Josh Shapiro, and state Senator John Hoffman, we seem to be back on a very dark but familiar road in American history—that of politically-motivated violence.

We should first note that we in the United States are unusually privileged. Political violence is an everyday reality in much of the world. In contrast, our lives have been relatively peaceful. To be sure, we've witnessed political violence in recent memory, such as 9/11. But targeted assassination seems to hearken back to the 1960s through the 1980s. Medgar Evers, JFK, RFK, MLK, Malcolm X, George Lincoln Rockwell, Fred Hampton, and Harvey Milk were all prominent victims during this era. Governor George Wallace was paralyzed by an assassin's bullet. And Presidents Gerald Ford and Ronald Reagan narrowly survived attempts on their lives. Many of you remember this era of turmoil.

Such violence, it should go without saying, is unacceptable. Fighting words with bullets is a lose-lose situation for everyone. We would also do well to remember that our Lord was also a victim of politically motivated violence. Jesus was no meek-and-mild milquetoast but spoke hard words to powerful people. Jesus was put to death precisely because he infuriated such people. The charge he was executed under was a political one: "The King of the Jews". Rome had no patience for would-be politicians and revolutionaries. Neither did the religious establishment, which had much to lose from the coming of the reign of God.

But Jesus was not an ordinary Jewish politician or revolutionary. Not once did he raise an army. Not once did he target his enemies for assassination. Not once did he preach retribution or revenge. He didn't even pick up a sword! The only violent act Jesus did in the gospels was use a whip in the Temple precinct (John 2:13-22). When his disciples try to begin an armed insurrection at Jesus' arrest, he tells them, "Put your sword back in its place, for all who take the sword will die by the sword" (Matthew 26:52). Jesus knows that violence only begets more violence.

Rather, Jesus proclaims the reign of God. And as citizens of this realm, we know that it is not merely another Eden. It is not a utopian project. It is not based on the right kind of laws or social manipulation. And it certainly isn't a fantasy for nice little people. The reign of God is an apocalyptic event. It is the inbreaking of a new way of being, based not on the world's values of retributive justice, accumulation, or merit, but on the sheer mercy, grace, and love of God. God's reign cannot be engineered. It can only be received.



#### Summary:

This Shalom reporting is through Aug/25, with a combined General and Building Funds deficit of \$34,089. The deficit is primarily due to Jan-Aug offerings under-budget by \$48,124. The General/Bldg Funds balance is about \$105,000, down from \$139,000 at the end of December/24. Based on reported receipts and supply expenses at the end of August, the July BBQ grossed \$16,077 with net proceeds of \$11,727.




