





He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' 8 And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly, for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. 9 And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone they may welcome you into the eternal homes. 10 "Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much, and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. 11 If, then, you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? 12 And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? 13 No slave can serve two masters, for a slave will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

PRESENTATION

Sponsors, parents, and child gather with the minister at the font.

In baptism our gracious heavenly Father frees us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord

Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; by water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God and made members of the church, the body of Christ. Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

Sponsors present the candidate for baptism.

Who here presents this child for baptism?

Response: We present Madelyn LeeAnn Steimel for baptism.

The minister addresses the parents.

- P Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ? Response: We do.
- As you bring your child to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in him hands the holy scriptures, and nurture *her* in faith and prayer, so that Madelyn may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace. Do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life? *Response:* We do.

The presiding minister addresses sponsors.

P Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Madelyn in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: We do.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

- People of God, do you promise to support Madelyn and pray for her in her new life in Christ?
- **G** We do.

We stand.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses the parents and sponsors of the baptized. The assembly may join in the responses.

- P I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.
- P Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? *Response:* I renounce them.
- P Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Response: I renounce them.

P Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? *Response:* **I renounce them.**

The presiding minister addresses the parents, sponsors, and the assembly.

- **P** Do you believe in God the Father?
- I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- **P** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

- P Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

- **P** The Lord be with you.
- **And also with you.**
- P Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- **G** It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- P We give you thanks, Heavenly Father, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you. Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.
- G Amen.

BAPTISM

- P Madelyn LeeAnn Steimel, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- Amen. You belong to Christ in whom you have been baptized. Alleluia.
- Let us pray. We give you thanks, Heavenly Father, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of each of the newly baptized, the minister prays:

- P Sustain Madelyn with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.
- C Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized

- P Madelyn LeeAnn Steimel, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- C Amen.
