Message from Rev. Wilson

SEASON OF CREATION

God's Great Creation

In Psalm 104:1-6, 10-23 the psalmist in his prayers adore God's greatness in creation, and imagines the depth of His majestic splendour through all His creation.

I recently read a story of a grandmom during a visit with her family to Florida who enjoyed watching a webcam that focused on an eagle family.¹ This observant granny said, "Every day the parent birds would keep a constant, protective vigil over the eaglet, bringing it fish from a nearby river for nourishment." For us too, our lives as humans depict this eagle family for us an image the psalmist gave us of God's magnificent creation in Psalm 104 from an array of creation images, of scenes from the work of God's creative hand.

From Psalm 104 we see the majesty of God's creation as it relates to the universe (vv. 2-4). We experience the creation of the earth itself – waters, mountains, valleys, etc. (vv. 5-9). We enjoy the God's gift of animals, birds and crops (vv. 10-18). We marvel at the cycles God created in our world – morning/night, darkness/light, work/rest (vv. 19-23).

What an amazing world God has created and fashioned with His hands for our enjoyment – and for His glory! "Praise the Lord my soul!" (v. 1). Each one of us can say thank You to God for all he has given us to appreciate and enjoy.

What is that thing that makes you marvel the most about God's creation? Take sometime to reflect and thank Him with a short prayer.

Let us pray

Almighty and Everlasting God,

All your creations praise you.

We are created for your purpose and all your creation declares your glory.

The gift of wealth we receive marks your presence in us;

The beauty, abundance, and peace are all tokens of your work in all creation. Work also in our lives, that by these signs we may see the splendour of your love and praise you through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. Thanks be to God!

Faith Horizons is the educational component of our Synod and we can accept anyone that is ready and willing to learn about this year's topic, "God Draws Near". The evening of the 17th is open to the public, but the workshops on the 18th are intended for Synod delegates, but if you have an interest in attending please reach out as we have a limited amount of free spots we can fill.

Friday, October 17 – Saturday October 18, 2025 at St. Johns College (92 Dysart Drive)

This year's Faith Horizon conference will be taking place on **October 17th-18th at St John's College**. The theme is "God Draws Near" and our keynote speaker will be Dr Collin Cornell. Dr Cornell is an astonishingly accomplished scholar with specialties in Hebrew Bible, Decolonial Missiology, and Ecotheology. Dr Cornell's Friday address will be open to the public and serve as this year's Wilmot Lecture, an annual lecture sponsored by St John's College focused on some aspect of the doctrine of God. On Saturday, Dr Cornell will take conference attendees deeper, and there will be other opportunities for worship and break-out sessions with local presenters. Remember, if you are a synod delegate, you are automatically eligible to attend, but others are always welcome. Registration to come in early September.
