Medical Missionary to South Africa

Dear Prayer Warriors and Faithful Supporters,

July, Aug, Sept 2025

Thank you all so much for your continued prayers. God is daily working in my life and ministry. If I have learned anything from missions in South Africa, it is to be prepared for the unexpected and be ready in a moments notice to adapt. The last few months have brought a few unexpected events. Of course, these events may have been unexpected to me, but the Lord was not surprised. In fact, He has used all to His glory and it has been amazing to see God's goodness and His grace in each situation. In July, the Womacks heard from the embassy that their visas had been denied and they had to leave the country to apply for their visas in the United States. This was an unexpected turn of events. However, it is amazing to see how God has used it for His glory.

September 2<sup>nd</sup>, I had surgery on my foot, and I am now recovering quite well from this, I thank you for your prayers. I also found out that the house I am renting has been placed on the market and once it sells, I will most likely need to find a new place to live. I would ask that you please pray for my housing situation. We do not always understand the paths set out before us, but we do know that God guides and directs us each step of the way.

## **Solid Rock Baptist Church**

The week before the Womacks departure, we had the opportunity to take several Xhosa teens to attend camp at Camp Rhino, where they heard the Gospel multiple times in their own language. The same week, we had an amazing two days of out of this world (Space themed) Vacation Bible School for our younger kids. It was a great week. While Matthew Womack is away the Lord has provided an amazing group of men to fill the pulpit, including several young men from another church, some of our own church men, as well as other missionaries in our area. It is so amazing to see how the church has pulled together and stepped up and been willing to be used of the Lord. We continue to see new people visiting our church quite frequently and the church is still growing in number and in spirit. God is good.

### **Homeless Shelter Ministry**

The Lord allows me to continue Bible Studies with several ladies at two different homeless shelters. My one group has grown from 2 to 4 ladies attending. We are currently studying "Women of the Bible". I often have the opportunity to counsel one on one with women and their stories are heartbreaking. Please pray that the Lord will reach these women with the Gospel of Christ. I also continue to keep up with the health and well-being of the men at the Men's Home and this month, I also had the opportunity to go to the shelter and do health screenings for the elderly and some of the staff. It is such a blessing to work with these people. Many of them do not have family and the reason that they live in the homeless shelter is their pension is not enough for them to be able to pay for a place to live.

# **Xhosa Language School**

I still continue to study Xhosa several days a week. I am starting to understand a bit more. Please continue to pray for me that I will gain a better understanding of the language and I will be more bold in using the language.

In July, I also had the opportunity to hold a Health Screening in a new location closer to our church. The people were in desperate need of medical care as well as the outreach of the Gospel. It is my plan to hold more such events in this area in the future. I continue to volunteer at Mosaic orphan ministry, keeping up with their healthcare needs. The state of the government healthcare system can be quite distressing at times. I encountered a 4-year-old child who had a stroke and they sent her home to follow up over a month later for physical therapy. I am so thankful that the Lord allowed me to be of some assistance in showing her caregiver some exercises to help her start working with her arm and leg.

# **Driver's License**

Getting my driver's license has been quite the adventure. The paperwork has been a problem, I have had a vehicle malfunction, and then I also have had a couple of failed attempts. It is not an easy task. I ask that you continue to pray for me. I am not giving up and know the Lord's timing is perfect. I am now praying that I will be able to complete this process before the end of 2025.

PLEASE CONTINUE TO PRAY: I continue to raise funds for a MOBILE CLINIC. The cost is about \$75,000-\$90,000 USD (difference due to exchange rate and vehicle costs).
