Luke 13:1-21 Small Group Guide & Discussion Questions

Introduction

- Welcome each person. Invite each person to say their name, where they live, how long they've been in Boston.
- Invite each person to describe how they are feeling today
- Listen carefully. Be curious, empathetic, caring!
- Invite a few people to read Luke 13:1-21 aloud e.g., sections v.1-5, 6-9, 10-17, 18-21
- Invite someone to pray for the Holy Spirit to illumine each person's heart and soul through this Scripture passage.

Discussion Questions

Feel free to adapt or skip any of these.

- 1. Are victims and survivors (Luke 13:1-5) both "offenders" (Lk 13:4)? Why or why not? Does it matter?
- 2. Compare and contrast the use of "ought" in Luke 13:14,16. How does this "ought" help us to understand Luke 4:18-19?
- 3. Jesus criticized the synagogue ruler and his congregants as "hypocrites" (Luke 13:15). How might the <u>congregation</u> of Restoration Fellowship also be accused as "hypocrites"?
- 4. Which simile (*seed* or *leaven* Luke 13:18-21) resonates more for you *personally* in grasping what the Kingdom of Heaven is like? Why?

Prayer

- 15 minutes before the end time, invite people to share any prayer requests.
- These could include personal issues, but all should be held in confidence.
- Invite several to pray out loud.
- Then as the group facilitator close up the meeting in prayer at an appropriate moment.
- Thank the group.
