Discussion Questions

- 1. Reflect on the conversation between Dave and Steve on Sunday about the 'power gifts'. What stood out to you?
- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 12:7-11. According to verse 7, why are spiritual gifts given? Who benefits from them? Which gifts are listed in verses 8-10? Which of these might you consider "power gifts"? How does Paul emphasize unity in verse 11? What does this tell us about who controls the distribution of gifts? What strikes you about the variety of ways God works through people? What other questions or observations do you have about this passage?
- 3. Have you ever seen or heard of someone using one of these gifts (healing, wisdom, discernment, etc.)? How did that experience point people to God? What dangers might come if someone used these gifts to draw attention to themselves rather than to God? How might power gifts help people who are exploring faith recognize that God is real?

Moving Forward

Continue to think about your own life and faith. Where might God be prompting you to use a gift He has given you—whether in your church community, your workplace, or your neighbourhood? How could stepping out in obedience to serve others open the door for God's power to be seen more clearly?
