I must leave to others everything I have earned. Ecclesiastes 2:18

You won't take it with you. You won't even desire to do so. Your possessions are for this world but after that they are worthless. We each only have a limited time on this earth, and when it's done, it's done. Everything we have built, everything we have accomplished, everything we have accumulated, even everything we have learned – it's all going to be dust much sooner than we can imagine.

A man who worked the late shift at a factory and walked home just after midnight. One night he took a shortcut through the cemetery. Failing to notice the new grave that had just been dug in the center of his path....., yep, he fell right in. After several unsuccessful attempts to get out, he decided to relax until morning when someone would be around to help him. Then he fell asleep.

The dark night continued peacefully, but then, suddenly another fella, who had overindulged at a local bar stumbled and......yep, fell into the same grave. Desperate to get out, this intoxicated man started yelling and clawing frantically at the sides. That's when the first man woke up and spoke up through the darkness saying: "It's no use, friend, I've tried. You'll never get out of here." The first man could have just said "Boo!"

Not surprisingly—hearing a voice from the dark grave, the second man jumped out, and almost out of skin, running for his life, never to drink again!

A periodic visit to the local cemetery – especially as October's Halloween approaches – might help us re-evaluate and reprioritize our life. For example, it might encourage us to stop and ask ourselves what are we really living for. Solomon had an aha moment like that: "All my hard work here on earth... I must leave to others everything I have earned." (Ecclesiastes 2:18)






