

Pastoral Pondering... Season of Transition

Life continues to change on the landscape around us and in the community of people we love. Sometimes it seems we are living in a constant season of transitions. This feeling is only heightened in the fall. The fields around us are changing quickly. What was standing tall in the morning has been harvested by the evening. Trees are showing off their fall colors. The air feels different in the fall, temperatures cool and daylight grows shorter. It is a beautiful season of change to enjoy.

Yet transitions come with a sense of loss. The beautiful colors on the trees only last for a short time before the leaves are blowing across the yard and the trees stand bear against the gray sky. All of the confirmation students chose playing "**The Game**" as their favorite confirmation memory so I asked Pastor Lee what "**The Game**" entails. Here is Pastor Lee's explanation of "**The Game**":

"The Game" at Confirmation is a review game. Each night of Confirmation, after we have invested time in fellowship and learning, it is time to review. "The Game" gets the students on their feet and excited to review the material that we have covered in class that night and all previous nights. Students select teams then stand at the raised quilting tables at the back of the Fellowship Hall. Each team is given small slips of paper and pens to write answers on. Each team selects one "runner". When I ask a question, they must work together to write down answers and be the first to run them, one at a time, and hand them to me. If the answer is correct the team gets a point. If it is wrong, they have to run back to the table and try to get a correct answer. Each team can only run one answer at a time to me. We play until it is time to leave for the evening. Sometimes we have a Bonus Question that can change the outcome of the game. For that question I back up even further away and ask something harder. The students are trying to win the Confirmation Cup; a trophy filled with candy. The team that wins runs forward as I empty the cup on the table or throw it in the air for all to enjoy. I'll admit, I really smile on the nights when the teams tie and everyone gets candy.

May God's blessings be upon Caeden, Tate, Addie, Jalen, Tanner and Macy as they grow in their relationship with God. Confirmation is not to be considered their "graduation from church" but "the beginning of their adult faith journey."

Aurora is a mom to three little ones; ages 1, 4, and 5. For the last three years, she's devoted herself fully to her family as a stay-at-home mom, pouring her energy into caring for her children and keeping her household running, often singlehandedly while her husband worked away from home most of the week.

One day, Aurora felt a stirring in her spirit, a desire to take a bold step toward something new. She began to ask herself a powerful question: "What's next for me?"

With courage and careful planning, Aurora decided to enroll in a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) course. It wasn't an easy decision. Balancing young kids, household responsibilities, and a demanding course load would be a challenge for anyone, but Aurora was determined. She mapped out a way to make it possible: she enrolled in a class held in the town where her parents live so they could help with childcare, and committed to a grueling commute 45-minute drive each way, every day with three young kids in tow.

Some days, the kids had to be up before sunrise. Some weeks, Aurora spent the night at her parents' home to make things a little easier for everyone. She studied after bedtime and fit in coursework between diaper changes, mealtimes, and playground runs. And through it all, she kept going with little sleep, deep determination, and a whole lot of love.

Even with her husband gone most weekdays for work, Aurora never gave up. She showed up for her kids and for her future. This summer, she achieved her goal by completing the CNA program!

Now, Aurora is on the job hunt, stepping confidently into a new chapter. She's building a career that will help support her family, give her a renewed sense of purpose, and show her children what it looks like to chase a dream and finish strong.




