A REFORMATION REMINDER

The last Sunday of October is always commemorated as Reformation Sunday. It's a reminder of the anniversary of Martin Luther posting the 95 Theses and setting in motion events that became the Protestant Reformation. Rev. Martin Luther was known for MANY things, but one of those many things is his composition of the hymn, A Mighty Fortress Is Our God. His inspiration for that hymn came from Psalm 46:

- ¹ God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.
 - ² Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea.
 - ³ though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.
- 8 Come, behold the works of the Lord; see what desolations he has brought on the earth.
 - ⁹ He makes wars cease to the end of the earth; he breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire.
 - ¹⁰ "Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations; I am exalted in the earth."
 - ¹¹ The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge.



In a world that is filled with so much uncertainty, so much pain and violence, so much fear, so much... you fill in the blank... we need to constantly be reminded that God IS our refuge and strength. Our annual recognition of the Reformation is our reminder that the only truth that can truly set us and this world free is the Word of God.




Note A: As of August 31, 66.67% of the year has elapsed, however, offerings as a percent of budget are only 59.69%. This indicates that offerings are approximately \$15,630 short of budgeted amounts. The month of August 2025 shows some improvement, since July 31, 2025, we were at \$29,000 short of budgeted amounts. **Note B:** Includes \$253,802.85 in roof replacement expenses and \$12,800.00 for parsonage window replacement (both of which were paid from insurance proceeds) and \$82,162.58 in property acquisition costs. Additionally, property liability insurance premiums of \$44,789.90 were paid which is an increase of \$24,000 from 2024.

Note C: Includes \$2,809.93 of Communities of Calling Funds.

Note D: Includes restricted amounts of \$15,000 for Little Blessings and \$1,610.69 for Sunday School.

Note E: Includes \$111,161.20 in grant funds.

HARVEST *Trail Mix*

This portable snack combines favorite fall flavors.



What you need:

- 1/4 cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- ²/₃ cup pecan pieces
- 1/3 cup roasted pumpkin seeds
- 1/3 cup almonds
- 1/4 cup raisins
- 2/3 cup dried fruit (any)

What you do:

- 1. Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.
- 2. Spread the mixture on a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let cool and harden.
- 3. Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.
- 4. Store in airtight container.
