- 2. In Hebrews 6:9, what pronoun transition takes place, whom does the author address, and what hope does he have?
- 3. What do you think are the "things that are better" that belong to salvation? How does this contrast with the description of the unbelievers and apostates of Hebrews 5:11-6:5?
- 4. After the severe warning to the unbelievers and pretenders in the congregation, what comfort is given to the believers in Hebrews 6:10?
- 5. How do these verses encourage you? What are a some Bible verses that you go to when you seek assurance that your faith is genuine?
- 6. According to Hebrews 6:11-12, what does the author desire for the remaining unbelievers in his congregation?
- 7. According to Hebrews 6:12, what is the opposite of being a dull of hearing unbeliever?
