October 2025

When I go on vacation or even to a pastoral retreat I always like to get back “Home”. It’s a grand feeling to get back, unpack, settle in and relax for a few minutes. My guess is that most of you know the same feeling of contentment after being away, followed by a deep breath and sigh of relief.

God feels the same way when he hears from you. Whether it was just this morning that you prayed over your breakfast meal, or it’s bedtime and you’re saying the Lord’s Prayer before you share your other thoughts with him, he’s always glad to hear from you. Yes, we know that the Holy Spirit intercedes for us and that our thoughts and worries are already known, but prayer should be a few moments that take our heart and soul to say “Thanks God” or “God here are my worries.” He’s as glad to hear from you as you are to speak to him as his beloved child. He’s always worried that we might drift away and that he’ll have to task the Holy Spirit with some sort of “reminder” that he wants us back. 😊

God just wants us to trust him that we can speak to him any time and in any moment. That helps us keep up our faith and trust in him. Yeah, we may not get what it is that we pray for but God (as a parent) knows what’s best for us and those around us. Trust that he has a plan and that we’re in it somewhere, somehow. A simple prayer, even that of a few words of thanks is sufficient for the moment that you have had a great day and want to tell him that.

Then there is The Lord’s Prayer that Jesus taught his disciples and we know from childhood. THAT’S a hard prayer to make it through and not to be distracted with some obscure thought that gets in the way of what we’re trying to say to God. But we make it through and go to sleep, hoping to wake up in the morning and talk with God again.

Blessings upon all of you and your prayers. Tell God that you love and trust him and that you’ll “talk with him again – very soon.” He needs to hear that as much as you need to say it.

This month I’ll be taking the back page of my letter to you and having a small topic for folks to consider.

PRAYERS – Also known as “petitions, intercessions, or thanksgiving.”

There are so many reasons to pray. We pray for ourselves, family, friends, our country and its leaders, and people of other countries suffering through so many troubles. We can pray at any time of the day, as we wake up and thank God for that, at meals, as we travel to/from work (but be aware of your driving), before bed and generally any time of the day. With thanks, hopes, fears, questions, help for ourselves and others we have so many reasons to pray. Most of our prayers are by ourselves and for so many reasons. But now, do we pray as a group, at home and as a family together? Yes, we pray at church – within that community of fellow believers and usually as part and parcel of our church service. But what else do we do to share our worries or gratefulness with God and with others?

How about this...start by gathering your family at the table for lunch or dinner. (Yeah, it may be tough) AND put away the cell phones (Tougher still) and then offer a mealtime prayer for thanks, but add in another topic or two for the “practice” of it all.

If it's a short meal prayer, that's a place to start. But try to make this a more common and daily habit. You may even want to involve the “kids” in saying the prayer. Write it down for them and ask them to take an active part in the thanksgiving words of thanks. Even if you're in your “Later years” of age, ask your kids over for a meal or “Ask yourself” to their home for a Sunday meal. Then introduce the idea. It's not as tough as dragging them to church, but it's a place to start. Bring your prayer book with you (remember we have daily devotions books in the narthex of the church) and expand on things. Have someone read the story of the day and then follow it with the daily prayer.

Overall though, prayer starts with us. We need to talk with God as often as we can. Yes, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us when we have a blank moment in our mind and are not sure what to say to God, but it'll get easier with time. It's easier than talking to your dad when you've done something wrong. Our Heavenly Father wants to hear from us about everything in our hearts.

SO.... think of this: Worry is a conversation you have with yourself about things you may not be able to change. PRAYER is a conversation you can have with God about things that he can change and take care of for you.

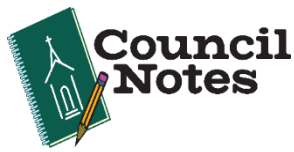
