PASTOR'S NOTE

"Then Jesus went with them to a garden called Gethsemane and told his disciples, 'Stay here while I go over there and pray.' Taking along Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, he plunged into an agonizing sorrow. Then he said, 'This sorrow is crushing my life out. Stay here and keep vigil with me.'

- *Matthew* 26:36-38

As we start out this new year, this new set of three hundred sixty five days, this new set of 525,600 minutes, our world has already experienced unprecedented disaster – most specifically and notably in the United States being the fires engulfing urban communities in Los Angeles. For many people there are many things that face us in the very near future which cause concern, or anxiety, or fear, or depression. Our hearts break at the devastation we are watching through screens, watching our neighbors of every walk losing their homes, their savings, their lives, and this is not the end of witnessing climate disasters and their immense devastating impacts.

In this time, the ways that we show up to and for our communities becomes even more essential. Our world continues to move at an immense pace around us, and globally there are trends shifting further and further into realms of fascism and dictatorship. There is no telling what will happen in the coming weeks, months, and years, but Dr. Rebecca M. David Hensley reminds us that "a Christian ethic for such a time as this calls us to stay awake to whatever atrocities might lie ahead in the coming [days]. It calls us to turn our anticipatory grief into communal grief through prayer vigils and public protests. It calls us to transform our communal grief into social activism that holds authorities at all levels accountable for the wellbeing of all peoples and all of God's sacred creation."1

There is much to grieve and there is much to worry about. And we have been here before. Now is the time for building resistant community together. Jesus asks us to stay awake and keep watch. Stay awake and pray. Stay awake and act comes next. And we can only do that together.

This is truly an ecumenical community ministry. Many of our guests are living in their cars or in tents. Others are families who have just moved here - many from warmer climates. Volunteers from Whitney and our greater community staff the Closet on Tuesdays and Saturdays and 3rd Friday evenings. We will be closing the Closet on January 18 but because of the wonderful donation of our storage shed, we will still be able to give out items to persons who contact the church and continue to receive donations.

Several years ago, someone donated a beautiful red wool cape to Joseph's Closet. Many women tried it but the cape was either too long or too large. One afternoon a tall, stately woman who was a newly arrived refugee from the Congo, came in. She rummaged through the coats, tried on several but nothing worked. As she looked in the mirror, we knew that not only would the cape keep her warm, it would also lift her spirits.
