

We are proud to announce Our 4th Annual Drive-Through Recycling Event in partnership with SCARCE! This year we are adding a battery collection! (Household batteries only, no car / boat batteries). The Rotary Club of Darien will be covering the cost of the shredding truck for document Shredding (tax, bank and medical records) Please NO plastic, NO rubber bands, NO big binder clips. Staples & paperclips are okay.

Additional organizations will be there collecting the following:

- DuPage County Sheriff's Office will be collecting Syringes, Epi pens. Sharps, lancets, medicine (over the counter or prescription), old vitamins.... Just put in one big plastic see thru bag, no bottles needed.
- Working Bikes will be collecting Bikes, bike repair tools, bike baskets, tire pumps
- Project C.U.R.E. will be collecting Medical Equipment walkers, crutches, canes,
- Darien Lions Club Darien, IL will be collecting eyeglasses, hearing aids, household keys, cell phones
- SCARCE will be collecting
 - o Books-paperback, hard cover, novels, textbooks, children's books
 - o Records 45s. LP, vinyl
 - o Musical instruments & sheet music

Committee Report

Finance:

August donations were good. The \$15,569 total is the third highest August in the last ten years, Exceeding a very weak 2024 (\$9,812) by \$5,756 and a weak 2023 (\$11,656) by \$3,913. August expenses (\$20,439) were higher than 2024 (\$18,911) by \$1,529 and higher than 2023 (\$17,668) by \$2,771. August operations generated a \$4,871 deficit. The year-to-date deficit increased to \$39,435, the deficit is the second highest at the end of eight months in the last ten years.

At the end of eight months, 66.67% of the year, 66.6% of the budget was spent. Most categories that exceeded 66.6% were highly seasonal. However, it should be noted that in prior years the percent expended has been several percent lower than the completed portion of the year.

Donations through August recorded in Shepherd's Staff agree in total and by fund with the financial records.

No pass-through funds are overdrawn. Ten on-line donations totaling \$633.82 were received by the last counters report date (08/25/25). There was one \$18 Thrivent donation (YTD there have been 6 Thrivent donations totaling \$402).

The balance sheet remains strong. There is no long term debt. Total assets have decreased by \$41,830 since 12/31/24. The decrease is due to the operational deficit and the Gathering Place project.

Council Highlights

Pastor's Report

- Expressed gratitude to Council for encouraging time away to be with family following his father's death.
- Outdoor Worship: Moved to new location near building for flatter ground and less traffic noise; experimenting with event tie-ins before/after worship (e.g., bonfire, "Paint with Pastor") to boost attendance.
- SLCT: South Loop Community Table restarted; Byron Levan and Mark Alterson volunteering; Thanksgiving meal will be provided by Lord of Life (no overlap with Mt. Carmel baskets).
- Livestream/AV: Views slightly down but still an effective outreach tool (recent newcomers came via YouTube). Improvements made to sound quality; humming traced to ground loop; new mic picking up organ music.
- Holden Village: Pastor Adam will be away September 25–28 for a retreat to learn about Holden and explore future congregational trips.

Property Committee Report

- Sanctuary "table/shelf" nearly complete.
- Gutters and gutter covers being installed/cleaned.
- Closets and outdoor touch-ups ongoing.

Parking Lot Seal/Restripe

• Wilson Paving to seal and restripe parking lot for \$4,500 (same price as three years ago).

HVAC (Narthex/Breezeway/Restrooms)

- Current unit (2012) has small heat-exchanger crack and refrigerant leak; estimated replacement \$15,000 including crane.
- Decision: Obtain at least two additional bids (e.g., Fire & Ice, Precision) using Stevens' specs; revisit in October.

Pastor's Health Insurance

• Pastor Adam uses VA benefits; coverage through Portico for Pastor Elle and family continues at lower cost than alternative.

New Members

- Byron Levan and Mark Alterson requested membership.
- Council discussed ELCA open table practice and membership requirements.
