The H.A.N.D.S. (Hope and Needles Doing Service) Gladbrook area prayer shawl ministry has been active for <u>13 years</u>. They began meeting weekly in November 2011 at Gifts of Grace, then Serendipity by Deb, then at Peace UCC and then at the Independent Living. Over 1300 shawls have been distributed to community people (and beyond) over the past years with the help of area churches and members. Shawls have also been made and

given for blessing couples getting married, the baptism of babies and also given to fundraisers to help out worthwhile causes.

There are many people that make this ministry a success. Thank you to all that create the shawls, donate yarn, donate funds for yarn and help make comfort tags that are attached to each shawl. The completed shawls are kept at Peace UCC (2nd floor classroom/nursery) and at the Methodist church. The ministry works with area clergy to get shawls to those in immediate need, but **you** also can help spread this ministry. If you think of a friend or relative that would like a shawl, all you need to do is choose one, record your gift on the notebook by the shawls and give it away.

Call the Peace Church to see the beautiful shawls waiting to comfort someone in need. The group prays that the recipient is touched by God's love and amazing grace and feels the blessings that have been knitted/crocheted into each shawl. -2 Chronicles 16:9-

When God spoke through His prophets it was an event of tremendous significance. There was clear direction as to what was to be done. When God revealed His will through His spokespersons-prophets and priests-the message was not always joyfully and enthusiastically received. More often than not, the men and women who spoke for God ended up in prison, or they faced the sword because the kings almost always preferred their own way to God's way.

If there is one theme which runs throughout the historical books of the Bible, it is this: When people honor God, God honors them; and when people forget God and turn from Him, adversity eventually comes. The law of the harvest-that we reap what we sow-is as old as humanity.

Second Chronicles chapters 20 and 32 tell of two men Jehoshaphat and Hezekiah-who both faced annihilation from their enemies. But when they turned to God and threw themselves at His mercy, He miraculously intervened and spared them.

Be reminded of two things:

Human nature never changes, and

God never changes either. He is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow (Hebrews 13:8). ⁸ Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

If there is one thing which the New Testament does, it brings us closer to God's help and makes His deliverance more personal. As Nahum put it,

Administrative Council Minutes

August 25, 2025

Susie Strohbehn called the meeting to order at 7:00 with 10 members present. In attendance were Dana Brown, Gideon Gallo, Cornell Gethmann, Dave Koester, Kyle Koester, Paul Koester, Roger Luehring, Grant Strohbehn, Susie Strohbehn, and Kevin Williams.

Dave K. shared a devotion. Moments of Discipleship and Spiritual Accountability were shared. May/June minutes were read and corrections were discussed. They were approved with corrections made. (Paul / Grant) The finances were discussed. The treasurer's report was approved as presented. (Dave/ Cornell)

Finance Committee - Grant stated he would like to meet in September or October to set the 2026 budget. Grant motioned to open a \$15,000.00 CD Ten thousand dollars coming from savings and five thousand coming from checking. Dave gave the second. There was some discussion. It was decided Roger would be given the authority to make the decision on length of term for the CD. Vote was taken. Motion passed.

<u>Gladbrook Methodist Women</u> - Dana reported that the GMW will be changing their regular morning meetings to the third Thursday of every month. The time will remain the same- 9:30am. This will begin September 18th.

We discussed the common missions for the rest of this year. This includes movie theater concessions volunteering, Trunk or Treat in October, Blessing Bags in November and our December Christmas luncheon. We will be inviting the women of 4 community churches to join us for Christmas lunch. We divided the donated school supplies between 3 schools- G-R, GMG and Marshalltown.

Food Pantry - The food pantry continues to help a consistent 15 to 20 people in our community. A list will be in the next newsletter.

<u>Good Samaritan Fund</u> – We were able to help a community member by paying half of his monthly rent. We have been receiving monthly donations from the Wednesday Morning Coffee Ladies group.

Memorial - The only change is a bit of interest earned.

<u>Mission Outreach</u> – September 12 will be the next Mission Outreach community event. The community will be invited to hot dogs and a movie in the church Fellowship Hall. Sept. 25 is the next free movie admission night. Downton Abbey is the expected movie. There were 25 people at the last movie night on August 23rd.

<u>Pastoral Report</u> – Pastor reported that between June and August he had 7 hospital visits, he attended the Upper Midwest Conference June 14th. In July he took part as the music director for a confirmation camp in Griswold, Iowa. He has made several home visits to congregation members who live out of town. He is still leading the morning women's Bible study on Tuesdays, morning men's Bible study on Wednesdays, and an evening Bible study on Wednesdays. He is expecting to start a confirmation class in September.

<u>SPPRC-</u> Dave reported the committee met on July 12th. At that time, staff evaluations were reviewed. Goals for next year were reviewed with Pastor. The next meeting will be September 9th. Salary recommendations will be discussed then passed on to the financial committee.

<u>Technology</u> – Roger shared that the web hosting from United Methodist Church will not be available to us any longer. Terri has been investigating other web hosting services. Our new website will be coming soon.

<u>Trustees</u> – The yard sign has been repaired. A problem with the organ couldn't be found. The company that we got it from is no longer in business. We will continue to watch it closely for any further problems.

Other business -

- The safety policies were discussed. Roger made a motion to adopt the safety policies with the revisions and corrections that were discussed. This would include a revision to review the policies yearly. Grant gave the second. A vote was made. The motion passed.
- -The committee working on the new bylaws are wanting to have the bylaws completed by the September or October board meetings. The safety policies took precedent.

<u>Joys & Concerns</u> – Joys: School has begun. We pray it is a safe an successful year for the staff and students.

Concerns: 1)There was a prank call about an active shooter at the Iowa State University campus.

2)The feeding tube for Deb Koester has been removed.

Gideon closed with prayer.


