Blessed autumn! We're getting back into our Bible book of the month

series where we take a look at a different book each month and see what there is to learn about the story of God and God's people. And this month we look at arguably the dullest title for a Bible book: Numbers. We are still in the Pentateuch – the first five books of the Bible at number 4. Numbers gets its name from an ancient Greek translation of the title of the book in the Torah, but in Hebrew, the Old Testament's original language, the book's title is translated as "In the Wilderness." Doesn't that sound more exciting? And it's more accurate to the action in Numbers, because the people Israel are still on their journey to the promised land that started back in the book of Exodus.

Numbers covers 40 years of wilderness journey, from camping in Sinai (chapters 1-10), the bulk of the journey itself (chapters 10-22) and on to the eastern side of the Jordan River valley (chapters 22-36) and ready to cross over. Only most of the original people that started the journey won't finish it. The next generation of descendants of the original Exodus story are the ones who will cross the river. Even Moses won't cross. (We'll come to that next month.)

There is a good deal of counting in Numbers which can lead one to think that this is where the book got its name. There's a census in chapter 1 and again in chapter 26, which shows how the people have grown in

number from generation to generation.

But Numbers is more than just numbers. We continue with Moses leading the journey with Aaron at his side, and we encounter stories like Balaam's talking donkey; spies bringing back grapes, manna and quails to the people and their ensuing complaints about them; Miriam and her illness; Moses' staff and serpent that when looked upon meant life and healing; and a whole host of other stories concerning how the law worked – or didn't – for various people. There's a lot of story in Numbers! Which speaks to you the most?

Remember to always keep the big picture in mind, especially with Numbers. The challenges for the people on their journey do add up in this book, and it can seem daunting as you read along. We too can face challenges that seem daunting in our lives today. But just like the people in Numbers – and the whole Bible, even – we don't face challenges alone. We have God there on the journey with us: guiding us, feeding us, and providing another way to look up and receive life and healing.

Enjoy reading Numbers and let me know what you think. In November we'll wrap up the Pentateuch and the Exodus journey in the book of Deuteronomy.
