

Sunday School Lesson Plan – Sunday, November 23, 2025

Here's a Sunday School Lesson Plan for young children (ages 4–8) using the Revised Common Lectionary readings for November 23, 2025 – The Reign of Christ, Proper 34 (Year C) Bible Verses: Jer 23:1-6; C 19 (Luke 1:68-79); Col 1:11-20; Lk 23:33-43

☆ □ Sunday School Lesson Plan – The Reign of Christ

Date: November 23, 2025

Liturgical Season: The Reign of Christ / Christ the King Sunday (Last Sunday after Pentecost)

Readings: Jer 23:1-6; Canticle 19 (Luke 1:68-79); Colossians 1:11-20; Luke 23:33-43

Lesson Title / Theme / Big Idea

- Title: Jesus is Our King
- Theme: Christ is the King who saves us and rules with love.
- **Big Idea:** Jesus is not a king like earthly rulers; He is the King of Love and the King forever.
- Lesson Focus for Kids: We celebrate Jesus as the King who forgives, loves, and brings peace.

Scripture Readings – Kid-Friendly Language

- **Jeremiah 23:1-6** God promises to send a good Shepherd-King to care for His people.
- Luke 1:68-79 (Canticle) God has come to save us through Jesus.
- Colossians 1:11-20 Jesus is the image of God, ruler of all creation, and head of the
- Luke 23:33-43 Even on the cross, Jesus shows He is King by forgiving and promising life.

Welcome & Opening Prayer / Circle Time

- Welcome children, sit in a circle.
- Share: "What do you think a king or queen does?" (write answers on a board/paper).
- Say: "Today we learn about Jesus, our King—but not like kings we see in storybooks. He is the King of Love."

Prayer:

"Dear God, thank You for sending us Jesus, the King of Love. Help us listen and learn today. Amen."

Memory Verse

Colossians 1:13 (simplified):

"God brought us into the kingdom of His Son, whom He loves."

(Have kids repeat with hand motions – crown on head for "kingdom," arms crossed over chest for "love.")

Bible Story Time

- Use a children's Bible or tell in your own words.
- Focus on Luke 23:33-43 Jesus on the cross, forgiving others, and welcoming the thief to paradise.
- Emphasize: Even on the cross, Jesus was still King because He showed love and forgiveness.

Ask questions:

- What do you think makes Jesus a different kind of King?
- How can we show Jesus we belong to His kingdom?

Craft / Activity

Craft Option 1: Crown of Christ the King

- Provide paper crowns, stickers, markers, or jewels.
- Write "Jesus is King" on each crown.

Craft Option 2: *Heart Scepter*

• Cardboard tube or stick, topped with a paper heart.

• Decorate with the words: "Jesus is my King."

Game

"Follow the King" (like Follow the Leader):

- Child plays the "king" leading others around the room.
- Remind them: "We follow Jesus our King by doing what He teaches."

Song Suggestions

- "Jesus Loves Me"
- "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands"
- "This Little Light of Mine"
- "King of Kings and Lord of Lords" (simple round/chorus)

Snack Suggestions

- Crown-shaped cookies (use crown cookie cutter)
- Fruit "jewels" (grapes, berries as jewels on a crown)
- Crackers & cheese

Wrap Up & Reflections

- Ask: "What kind of King is Jesus?" (He loves, forgives, cares for us, rules forever.)
- Remind them of memory verse.

Closing Prayer

"Dear Jesus, thank You for being our King. Help us follow You and share Your love with others. Amen."


Take-Home Idea

- Send kids home with their **crown craft**.
- Handout with the **memory verse** and a simple family discussion question: *How can we show Jesus is King in our home this week?*

Teacher Notes

- Focus on love and forgiveness rather than crucifixion details (age appropriate).
- Emphasize *Christ the King Sunday* as a joyful celebration.
- Keep activities simple, visual, and interactive.





Maze


Help the crown find its way: Jesus.


The Bible has many names for Jesus. Here are five:
