

The Proclamation of the Word

First reading - Wisdom 11:24-12:1 Reader: Roxee

The Book of Wisdom (sometimes known as the Wisdom of Solomon) is from a collection of texts known as the Apocrypha which are considered part of the Scriptural tradition in some branches of Christianity, but not all. The Book of Wisdom encourages its readers to love righteousness and seek wisdom.

For you love all things that exist and detest none of the things that you have made, for you would not have formed anything if you had hated it. How would anything have endured if you had not willed it? Or how would anything not called forth by you have been preserved? You spare all things, for they are yours, O Lord, you who love the living.

For your immortal spirit is in all things.

Psalm− Psalm 148:7-14

Cantor: Pauline

Paul comes to the end of his letter to the Christians in Galatia, a Roman province in central Asia Minor. The final lines focus on Christ's crucifixion and resurrection as the essential elements of being a follower of Jesus.

May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me and I to the world. For neither circumcision nor uncircumcision is anything, but a new creation is everything! As for those who will follow this rule—peace be upon them, and mercy, and upon the Israel of God.

From now on, let no one make trouble for me, for I carry the marks of Jesus branded on my body.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brothers and sisters. Amen
