Preach the word, be urgent in season and out of season, convince, rebuke, and exhort, be unfailing in patience and in teaching. 2 Timothy 4:2

I had the great privilege to spend the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in Lutherstadt Wittenberg, Germany. I had the greater privilege to be staying in the home of close friends. In the German state of Saxony, Reformation Day is a holiday when families go to special Reformation Day markets or to the park or to church. I saw many young families enjoying the mild weather, many of whom were pushing small children in strollers.

What I didn't see were the familiar trappings of Halloween, which we observe on October 31—Reformation Day. After a full day of multiple church services, a couple concerts and sampling all the regional treats available at the market in the town square, my friends and I settled down to a quiet evening snack—no room for dinner!—consisting of red wine and pistachios, both products of the Fresno area I brought with me.

Then . . . a knock on the door. Two kids, in homemade costumes, yelled "Sweet or Sour!" the German equivalent of "Trick or Treat." My hostess dutifully handed out candy and commented on how cute the kids looked. Her husband had a much different reaction. He wasn't opposed to the idea of Halloween—he just thought October 31 should be reserved for Reformation Day only.

I cherish both and, different from our German co-religionists, we celebrate Reformation Day on the closest Sunday before the 31st, not on the 31st itself. Unless the 31st falls on Sunday, which isn't often.

This year, Reformation Sunday is October 26th and our annual "Trunk-or-Treat" will be on the 31st. We have the best of both worlds—marking the inauguration of the Reformation and welcoming the children of the neighborhood onto our campus for a fun and safe Halloween. The message to Timothy was that the gospel is not confined to a single day or season, but is for every day of the year. I hope you will participate in both!

I completed my clinical pastoral education (CPE aka chaplaincy internship) at Community Regional in August, which ended up being one of the most transformative experiences I have gone through in my life and has greatly informed the type of pastor/ministry leader I wish to be. I am excited to continue to cultivate these skills on Fridays as I serve as a volunteer chaplain at both Community Regional and Clovis Community! After CPE, I had to prepare for my endorsement interview with our synod's ordination candidacy committee—which took place while I was at a multicultural young adult gathering hosted by the ELCA in New Orleans!

The multicultural young adult gathering was a life-giving experience for me as I was able to learn more about the ethnic communities within the ELCA and the need for more young adult representation from the attending ethnic groups. Enough about me. What's been happening in NextGen Ministries? While I was completing CPE, Lisa, Kayla, and Jose provided the best summer experience for our children and youth. They had pool parties, they went to Woodward Park, they went to the trampoline park, they watched Lilo & Stitch at the movie theater, and they offered the kids and youth a safe, cool place to unwind during the day. We concluded the summer and kicked off the school year with our Back to School Bash, which we were able to serve families from both the Enlightened Minds homeschool charter that meets on our campus during the week and families from Centennial. ADULT BIBLE CLASS

Sundays in the conference room @9:00

For 2025 the **Sunday Morning Adult Bible Class** has been looking at the Old Testament Prophets and other writings, as they appear in the *Lectionary*. The *Revised Common Lectionary* (RCL) is widely used:

- 3-year cycle of Bible readings for Christian worship, designed to be used across various denominations and countries
- It follows the Church's liturgical year and provides a structured schedule of readings for each Sunday and major feast days, with the goal of unifying worship experiences and allowing for communal study and planning.
- The RCL's readings generally include a passage from the Old Testament (Hebrew Bible), a Psalm, an Epistle reading, and a Gospel reading.
- The focus shifts to a different Gospel each year (Matthew in Year A, Mark in Year B, and Luke in Year C); we are currently in Year C, studying Luke. The Gospel reading for each Sunday provides the primary focus for the service, and the other readings are thematically linked to it.

October 5 - Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4

October 12 - 2 Kings 5:1-3, 7-15c

October 19 - Genesis 32:22-31

October 26 - Jeremiah 14:7-10, 19-22
