

SOAP Devotional Guideline: Partnering with God in Prayer

Scripture: 1 Timothy 2:1-4 ESV

Theme: God invites us to partner with Him in prayer for all people, aligning our hearts with His desire for salvation and peace.

Scripture

- Read: 1 Timothy 2:1–4 slowly and prayerfully.
- Reflective Questions:
 - O What words or phrases stand out to you?
 - How does this passage describe God's heart for people?

Observation

- **Reflect:** Notice the four types of prayer: supplication, prayer, intercession, and thanksgiving.
- Reflective Ouestions:
 - o What is the difference between these types of prayer?
 - Why do you think Paul urges prayer for "all people," including leaders and those in authority?
 - o What does this reveal about God's character and priorities?

Application

- Apply: Consider how you can practice each type of prayer this week.
 - Supplication: What needs—personal or communal—can you bring before God?
 - Prayer: How can you set aside time for reverent communion with God?
 - Intercession: Who needs you to "stand in the gap" for them today?

o Thanksgiving: What are you grateful for right now?

• Reflective Questions:

- How can you pray for local, national, and global leaders—even those you disagree with?
- In what ways can your prayers contribute to peace in your home, church, or community?
- Who is God putting on your heart to pray for their salvation?

Prayer

- **Pray:** Use the passage as a guide. Pray for:
 - All people, especially those in authority.
 - Peace and godliness in your community.
 - The salvation of specific individuals.
 - A heart of gratitude in all circumstances.

Reflective Questions:

- What do you sense God inviting you to partner with Him in prayer about?
- How can you make prayer a consistent part of your daily life?
