The Rector's Corner

Samuel Leonard Tilley, a native of Gagetown and a long-time resident of Saint John, and one of the New Brunswick Fathers of Confederation, was deeply convicted about honouring the Lord with obedience. An Anglican, he taught Sunday school, eventually became a churchwarden, and was a committee member of the Saint John Religious Tract Society.

Tilley owned his own drug store in Saint John and became interested in the economic future of his adopted city. By the late 1840's he joined with other Saint John leaders to promote the development of an intercolonial railway that would link Saint John with the Gulf of St. Lawrence and the United States. They envisioned a Maritime Union that would be a step towards providing financing for this project. However, at a meeting in Charlottetown, in 1864, with observers from Quebec and Ontario in attendance, the idea of a Maritime Union was expanded to include a union of the Maritimes and Canada. John A. MacDonald and his Canadian colleagues promised the Maritimers an intercolonial railway and a national market for their industries if they joined with Canada.

Of course, you know the rest of the story; but permit me to add this final detail: as a Christian, Tilley read the Bible every day. One morning, during the negotiations in London when the British North America Act was being drafted, he was reading Psalm 72, verse eight, which says: "He shall have dominion also from sea to sea". Inspired by what he read, he suggested the title 'dominion' for the new national union – the Dominion of Canada. It was one way of pledging obedience to the Lord Who had both given and directed this new nation.

This weekend, let us consider the principle of holy obedience – for us as individuals, for our families, for the Church, and for Canada. It is a necessity – a call from our faithful Lord to us in this morning's Old Testament Lesson: "You shall keep the commandments of the Lord your God, to walk in His ways and to fear Him." (Deuteronomy 8.6). We shall have no life, nor happiness, nor future if we reject His Ways. On the other hand, if we remain in Him, we shall find our purpose, His Peace and perfect joy.

A Whole Week of Thanksgiving!

Today, some parishes choose to focus on our blessings as a nation; and next Sunday, to give thanks for the harvest.



On **National Thanksgiving**, in addition to the peace and freedoms we

enjoy as Canadians, we may humbly pause to reflect upon the abundance of water, minerals, and lumber resources that we have received from God. And then, we may pray how to be good stewards of them. On **Harvest Thanksgiving**, the 'Form of Thanksgiving for the Blessings of the Harvest' (pages 617-619, Book of Common Prayer) not only speaks of fruits and vegetables, but also of the spiritual harvest when the Lord Jesus returns as our King and Judge. In all things, let us give thanks! (1 Thessalonians 5.18)
