Review:

I. A Threefold Call (23)

A disciple is one who surrenders self-will to follow Jesus.

II. A Threefold Cost vs Gain (24-26)

The *gain* in following Jesus far *outweighs* the *cost*.

<u>Joyful surrender</u> is a characteristic of an Everyday Disciple!

- 2. Read Luke 9:23-26. What word or phrase jumps out to you? Why?
- 3. Briefly explain each of the three word-phrases Jesus used to describe what is required to be His disciple in Luke 9:23.

Summarize this in a word or phrase. What is your initial reaction to entering into a life like this?

Surrendering self-will to the will of God is not easy. What are some of the aspects that make it hard? What helps you to live a surrendered life?

4. Jesus used three paradoxical statements in Luke 9:24-26 to teach the gain verses the cost of a surrendered life. Briefly compare the gain verses the cost of each one.
