Pastor's Message

John 20:19-21 "When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors were locked where the disciples were, for fear of the [Jewish authorities], Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

Dear Saints.

Grace to you and peace, in a world that seems to have lost a sense of grace and has mostly responded to anxiety and fear by directing venom to the other side.

Thanks be to God, Jesus spoke into a season of chaos, a world for his disciples that was turned upside-down. Jesus said, "Peace be with you."

I wonder if there have been times when you too have felt a little displaced or unmoored. In many places around the world, people are feeling acute shifts, if not chaos.

After the resurrection, still grieving Jesus's crucifixion, Jesus's disciples locked the doors out of fear. They were afraid that guilt by association might lead them to be crucified next. The words of Jesus, in this time of terror, speak loudly.

Somehow Jesus knew exactly what was needed. Jesus did not bring food or water. Jesus did not bring bandages or clothing. Jesus brought God's enduring love, and words of peace.

I wonder if we can serve as "apostles of peace". When the chaos stirs us up, the peace of Christ can hold us fast. When darkness turns us against each other, the words of Jesus serve as a "crisis absorbent" gift. When fear splits us apart, the words of Jesus can hold us together.

Perhaps, Jesus has also given us a new direction, to remind us who we are. Jesus speaks peace to the whirlwind, but more often he speaks of grace for poor people.

Jesus said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." I wonder, once we have come to a peaceful place, we can faithfully turn outwards to share God's peace within our community.

October, 2025

Your Parish House Return to Housing Project working group has continued to meet and work

toward the shared mission of serving our community, being good stewards of our property, and

increasing the stock of affordable, transitional housing in Longmont.

We have been in the 'hurry up and wait' stage as the State of Colorado law, which allows for

Accessory Dwelling Unit development, has been implemented by Longmont Planning and

Zoning. We now have an understandable path forward to add an additional apartment to our

Parish House. We will be able to double the number of families we serve each year!

Before we can submit a building permit application, our working group:

- Has created preliminary drawings to be shared with our congregation and the OUR Center.
 These preliminary drawings will be the basis for a building permit application.
- Has offered options for funding facilities projects to our Congregational Council.
- Has requested an opportunity to share plans with our congregation in advance of acongregational vote to approve the project
- Will choose a general contractor to manage remodeling the Parish House and creationof two 3-bedroom apartments.

We promise to stay in touch with our congregation and Congregational Council!


