

WEEK 3 THE MARRIAGE COMMITMENT

Spouses can drive each other crazy.

When dating, opposites attract, and once married, opposites attack!

What does commitment look like in a healthy marriage? How do we live that out?

Matthew 19:3-6

- ³ Some Pharisees came to [Jesus] to test him. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any and every reason?"
- ⁴ "Haven't you read," [Jesus] replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' ⁵ and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? ⁶ So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

TYING THE KNOT

There are three approaches to marriage in our culture today:

The first approach to marriage is casual.

Sex and marriage aren't a big deal. It doesn't really matter.

The second approach to marriage is contractual. A contract is based on mutual mistrust.

The third approach to marriage is covenantal.

Marriage is a sacred commitment to God and to each other.

UNDERSTANDING THE MEANING OF COVENANT Covenant = to cut a deal

Genesis 15:8-11; 17-18a

- ⁸ But Abram said, "Sovereign Lord, how can I know that I will gain possession of [this land]?"
- ⁹ So the Lord said to him, "Bring me a heifer, a goat and a ram, each three years old, along with a dove and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ Abram brought all these to him, cut them in two and arranged the halves opposite each other; the birds, however, he did not cut in half. ¹¹ Then birds of prey came down on the carcasses, but Abram drove them away.
- ¹⁷ When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, a smoking firepot with a blazing torch appeared and passed between the pieces. God, represented by the pot and torch, was the only party who passed through the carcasses. ¹⁸ On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram...

Another example of a covenant agreement:

Jeremiah 34:18

¹⁸ Those who have violated my covenant and have not fulfilled the terms of the covenant they made before me, I will treat like the calf they cut in two and then walked between its pieces.

Marriage and intimacy matter to God and should matter to us.

Hebrews 13:4

⁴ Marriage should be honored by all. And the marriage bed should be kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral.

Every marriage is as good as the choices we make.

Every word matters. Every action is important.

And God's grace is available even when we have failed in our commitment.

¹³ If we are unfaithful, [God] remains faithful, for he cannot deny who he is.
