#### **Off-Street Parking: Removing Barriers**

As part of our *Grow in Grace* campaign, St. James is pursuing up to seven off-street parking spots along Hamilton Street, including one accessible space near the ramp.

This project serves two goals: making it easier for parishioners with limited mobility (especially in winter) and easing congestion on our narrow street so neighbours can exit their driveways safely.

Progress & Costs: The matter has been discussed with Fraser Paving and engaged an engineer at MTE. The Grow In Grave campaign has set aside \$40,000 to create off-street parking. Currently, the parish is working with the city to arrive at an acceptable plan. Find a rendering of the concept below.



#### **Building and Property Updates-**

There has been lots going on in the background over the summer and it will continue in the Fall.

Trees- Tree trimming will be done on many trees across the property later this Fall possibly in November.

Eavestrough repairs- Some of the eavestroughs will be repaired this Fall as well. There was significant damage from a large piece of ice to the eavestroughs by the side door off Hamilton Street.

Nave Flooring- As you may have noticed previously damaged tiles located near the grand piano in the Church have been repaired. The Piano also had new dolly wheels put on it. Excellent work!

Sacristy/Ramp entrance steps- a badly damaged step has been nicely repaired.

HVAC Compound off William street- the area has been cleared out - it had a lot of junk in there- all has been disposed off.

Tower- updates have been regularly given- but all the masonry work is complete and scaffolding will be taken down in the next month or so. Work continues now on metal work and also the south foundation wall.

South roof project- Pow Engineering has provided a revised cost.

As you can see our Building committee has worked hard to keep our property and building safe and in good repair.

Thank you to Terry Marklevitz and his committee for all they have done and will continue to do. We save a lot of money by having a great crew who do many jobs as volunteers. On behalf of the Church, we are very thankful for this group!
