Pastor Chad's Ink

"Good Communication is Worth a Lot"

The Bible has passages that support sound communication, whether it is for ministry, or at home with our families, or when we are out with friends. The scriptures emphasize being a good listener. How many times have we caught ourselves only half listening to another because our minds were busy figuring out what to say next? Good communication means being focused on the speaker entirely. The words will come to us as to how to respond. Grace and kindness in speech is also the trait of a good listener. Grace is unconditional love for our listening friend. Discerning what things to say, before we say them, can keep our tongues from harming others. Are you speaking pre-maturely about someone? Are you giving someone the benefit of the doubt rather than quickly criticizing them? Is avoiding gossip hard for you to do sometimes?

Some key verses on communication include James 1:19 ("be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry") and Proverbs 15:1 ("A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger"). May we have a discerning mind and tongue when we speak to others and as well when we are listening—making sure to ask the speaker if we heard them correctly. We might ask them, "Okay, is this what I am hearing you say?" Those words help us to understand, and they provide notice to the speaker that they are being understood.

Traits of a good communicator are very useful in our servanthood for God. Here are some key principles as well:

Key Principles from Scripture

Listen Actively:

Give your full attention when others speak to show respect and achieve deeper understanding.

Speak with Grace:

Ensure your words are helpful, build others up, and are "seasoned with salt" to create an inviting atmosphere.

Choose Words Carefully:

Your speech has the power of life or death; use words to build up, not tear down.

Be Quick to Listen, Slow to Speak:

Prioritizing hearing and understanding over immediately speaking helps prevent conflict.

Avoid Gossip and Harsh Words:

Gossip separates friends, and harsh words stir up anger. Instead, choose words that are soothing and beneficial.

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL TUESDAY, AUGUST 19, 2025 (REVISED)

ATTENDANCE: Chad Christensen (Pastor), Beth Hanggi (SPRC), Kelly Amunrud (Trust Fund), Lisa O':Neil (Ad

Council Chairperson), Tyler Kispert (Treasurer), Kathy Bartz, Lois Lepp, Janet Bugarin, McKenna Freerksen, and Michelle Hargrave (District Superintendent).

MEETING: Lisa called the meeting to order and Pastor Chad opened the meeting with a prayer.

SECRETARY: The July Ad Council minutes were distributed. Motion was made to approve the minutes. Motion was seconded and approved.

TREASURER: End of July balance \$14,574.76. (Set aside for parsonage \$7,482.07). Memorial fund end of July balance \$19,753.21.

TRUST FUND: End of June balance \$90,073.61. End of July balance \$90,732.76

Tuck and Point: Quotes were presented. One quote from Benike was \$47,100 (which included our stone sign). This could be broken down into three stages based on priority with first stage quoted at \$31,600. A second quote from Building Restoration Company was \$32,219 or \$42,848 (this second number included to cut out and replace 100% of sealant in all stone joints, wind, door, and penetration perimeters). BRC quote did not include our stone sign. Questions were raised and discussion was had. A motion was made to use Trust Funds to hire Benike and do everything at once rather than in stages, pending some questions that Kelly will take back them. Motion was seconded and approved. Kelly will work with Benike.

TRUSTEES:

Parsonage: A walk through was done on 8/6/25. Small repairs were taken care of. New fire extinguisher, smoke detector, and carbon monoxide detector were installed. A new water softener was installed. Door lock: The church has replaced both the East and West door with keypads. The same code is used.

SPRC: No report

PASTOR: (See page 2) Pastor Chad requested August 30 and 31, 2025 off. He will find a replacement.

OTHER BUSINESS:

- September Community Dinner / annual fundraiser: We discussed our fundraiser annual pork dinner. We are going to send a flyer to all members as well as change the verbiage on the flyers and add a QR code for subsplash in order to raise more funds. Menu will be pork loin, mashed potatoes and gravy, green beans, buns, and fruit bars.
- Mold: There is mold in the basement. Kelly will contact Paul Davis Restoration 507-330-6530 to give us a quote to have this removed. It has been noted on the exterior walls, both stairwells, furnace and utility room area, as well as the nursery.
