Colossians 3:12-17



- Am I presenting myself honestly, avoiding hypocrisy?
- Can I be trusted, and do I keep confidences?
- Do I spend time with the Bible daily?
- Do I enjoy praying?
- When did I last share my faith with someone?
- Do I pray about my spending?
- Do I knowingly disobey God?
- Do I act on things my conscience questions?
- Am I jealous, critical, irritable, or distrustful?
- How do I spend my free time?
- Is there anyone I resent or avoid, and what am I doing about it?
- Have I become a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?
- Do I complain often?
- Have I followed the Spirit's promptings to serve others?
- Have I heeded warnings not to sin?

The Sacraments of the Church Baptism

Baptism is a sacred sign of God's promise to be with us. Through baptism, we are born anew by God's grace and welcomed into the church family, becoming part of God's continuing story. Baptism reminds us we are initiated into Christ's church, included in God's saving actions, and given new birth through water and the Spirit.

Those seeking baptism are invited to renounce evil, repent, and accept God's power to resist injustice. They are asked to confess faith in Jesus Christ and promise to serve him, joining the church that welcomes people of all ages, nations, and races. Responses to these vows are "I do" or "Yes." The church practices infant baptism with confirmation as children mature, and offers baptism and membership classes for adults. All ages are welcome.

Holy Communion

Holy Communion is the sign of God's covenant with the church—a symbol of God's self-giving love. In this sacrament, we remember Christ's life, death, and resurrection. The bread and cup remind us of Jesus's hospitality and miracles, including feeding the five thousand. Everyone is invited to Christ's table, to seek forgiveness, healing, and grace. Communion nourishes us in our mission, and all are welcome to share in this meal of hope and peace.

Becoming a Member

Becoming a United Methodist begins with a desire to grow as a disciple of Jesus Christ in community with others. The first step is baptism and a commitment to active participation in the local church. Baptism marks the beginning of a lifelong journey in Christ; those who have not been baptized will receive the sacrament, while those previously baptized reaffirm their Baptismal Covenant as part of their membership vows.

New members promise to live faithfully as disciples through their prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. Anyone interested is encouraged to speak with a pastor to learn more about membership and beginning their journey as a follower of Jesus Christ.
