For those who long for choral singing, here's your chance to arrive early at 3:30 for a "pick up choir" rehearsal! We will sing together during the offertory! A community fellowship meal will be served following our worship time together.

Salvation Essay #6. A Brief Essay; Jesus and Salvation. "The Way" in Transition. By Jeff Swanson, Interim Pastor at New Hope Lutheran Church, El Paso Texas

The early followers of Jesus referred to their faith as "The Way." Probably this was based on Jesus' teaching that he is "The way, truth and life." Key and essential were Jesus teachings about "salvation" leading us through the challenges and imperfections of life, into eternal life.

The Way was born in Jerusalem and nearby surrounding areas. Peter was the leader in Jerusalem and essentially converted Jewish people to The Way...by presenting Jesus as a fulfillment of God's promises about sending a Messiah to save them. Outside of Jerusalem, there were Jews and people of other faiths ... who also heard the Christian message and became converted to The Way. Both groups were plunged into tumult.

Jerusalem Christians: Jews largely rejected Christians as heretics. Romans considered Christians a reform offshoot of Judaism. Jews also challenged Roman authority and rebelled. There was ongoing insurgency, guerrilla war, against the Romans after Jesus' crucifixion in 33 AD. In 67 AD the Romans sent about 10,000 combat troops from Syria to seize control and restore order. They made a BIG MISTAKE. The combat troops carried equipment to build a base camp. They were NOT configured with weapons ready for fighting. Jewish insurgents ambushed them, drove them to the sea and killed about 5,800. The Romans responded by sending nearly 50,000 troops. From 67-70 AD the Romans destroyed the temple in Jerusalem which was about five times bigger than our largest sports stadiums today! About 1.1 million people were killed and at least 100,000 were made slaves. Catapults, bladed weapons, arrows and fire! Bloody times! Imagine being an early follower of Jesus in the midst of the tumult. Israel ceased to be a nation until 1948 when Allies created and imposed a Jewish homeland.

Christians outside Hebrew lands: Paul was a Jew; NOT in Jerusalem, but in Syria. Around 36 AD, a young Christian named Stephen proclaimed his faith and some Jews became upset. The Romans retained exclusive right to decide Capital Punishment. They largely reserved this for crimes such as treason and murder. Stephen did neither. Yet a mob decided to kill Stephen for religious heresy, by stoning. Throwing stones is hard, sweaty, work so the killers removed their coats. Paul came along on a visit to Jerusalem, likely to arrest and imprison Christians and approved of the killing. Paul guarded the coats, probably from pickpockets and thieves. After the killing, Paul had a change of heart and head. He switched from being a persecutor of Christians to the most prominent missionary. His letters

survive as informative writings; 13 of the 23 writings (excepting the 4 Gospels) and about 24% of the New Testament. He established at least 14 churches during 4 missionary journeys. Between 47-57 AD he traveled to Turkey, Syria, Israel, Spain, Malta, Greece, Rome, Cyprus, Malta and more!

Saint Luke was another early convert to Christianity. He was from Antioch, Turkey. He wrote 27.5% off the New Testament, including the Gospel of Saint Luke and Acts of the Apostles, which is early church history.

Many of the Jewish Christians from the Hebrew lands wanted converts to first become Jews and follow Jewish laws. Imagine telling males in the Greek, African, Roman and other Mediterranean lands that they had to be circumcised in order to become Christians! Yikes! There was no infection nor pain control. Yikes again! So The Way adapted; welcomed conversion based upon the confession of faith in Jesus who loves us and provides salvation.

Between the Roman destructive attacks upon Jerusalem, and the hard work of Saint Paul, Saint Luke, and the scores of followers....The Way largely disconnected from the Hebrew lands, transitioned to the wider Roman Empire. The message was that God's free and unmerited grace, via Jesus, provides salvation. "Welcome!" was the inclusive format.

Then resistance to The Way began.... Lions, Tigers, Bears, Oh My! Fire and Gladiators too!



Reformation Sunday, October 26

This is a day to focus on knowing God truthfully and understand who we are as people of faith and children of God in light of God's unbelievable grace. Reformation Sunday is a festival day where we celebrate and remember our history, but it should also be a day to reexamine our faith. The message of Reformation Sunday is God's love for us. It is a love that frees us and redefines us a people of God and as members of the whole body of Christ. His love works in our hearts to help us shine for Him.

Martin Luther's faith journey began with an errant belief that God's demand for righteousness must be satisfied by our own doings. We are saved through faith alone that is received through grace alone, by authority given through Scripture alone. All of this is through Christ alone. Martin Luther sparked the Reformation with his 95 Theses, but realized that salvation comes through faith and not works ignited the revolution that changed the world.





Oct. 31, is Reformation Day. As the church remembers over <u>500 years of the Protestant</u> <u>Reformation</u>, we are also reminded of our need for Jesus. Given recent <u>incidents of hate</u>, intolerance and violence, Jesus' message and way of life continue to be relevant today.

In his words and actions, Jesus conveyed a word of God and a word from God. In other words, we know about God's project for humanity, God's kingdom, because of Jesus Christ. Even though Jesus was wrongly accused, tortured and executed, his word about God lasts forever. His resurrection was the divine vindication of his whole life.

In his life, death and resurrection, Jesus promoted solidarity, community, communion with God and each other, mercy, compassion, grace and justice. We all need to hear this message. We all need grace and compassion. God calls us—Christ's church for the sake of the world—to proclaim Jesus' teachings.

On this Reformation Day, my prayer is this: May God's Spirit continue to reform our message so that Christ may be formed in us and in our world.

Martin Luther, the 16th-century German reformer, pastor and church teacher, is another historical example of a Christian proclaiming the word of God to a world in crisis. And Martin Luther King Jr. proclaimed the word of God during the Civil Rights Movement in the 1960s. Both men proclaimed the gospel message to our hurting world in order to spread love and justice. Neither was perfect. Luther's anti-Semitic writings still haunt us as Lutherans, while King's personal shortcomings are also well-documented. Nevertheless, we hold dear their proclamation of the justifying grace of God. We are encouraged by their words calling for a renewal of society, so that our dreams of equality may one day be our reality.

According to Luke 4:16-20, Jesus, while in his hometown of Nazareth, read the following verses from Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

If our proclamation is not informed, shaped and grounded in Jesus' life, actions and teachings, we run the risk of proclaiming our way and not God's. When our way is preached, we get bigotry, racism, sexism, war, intolerance, violence and apathy toward those who are powerless and voiceless. Like Luther and King, we must strive to bring freedom to those who are oppressed.

On this Reformation Day, my prayer is this: May God's Spirit continue to reform our message so that Christ may be formed in us and in our world. Freed by God's grace, may we boldly proclaim the love of Jesus Christ—word from God and word of God. Let our mouths give voice to hope.

Thrivent Choice "Make a Personal Donation" Maybe you have heard it said many times "follow the prompts" to make a personal donation and have no clue what that actually means or how it works! So here's a little cheat sheet, I did some exploring to figure it out.

First of all, you don't have to be a Thrivent member to use this feature.

Second, it's a way to give via your credit card and rack up more points or miles and the organization (New Hope or someplace else) will get a record of your personal donation and should track that gift for you in the same way as if you had put a check in an envelope, it should be recorded by them for you

Third of all this is DIFFERENT than designating Thrivent Choice dollars for those of you who are Thrivent members
Fourth, it's not so easy as just having a link which is specific to New Hope, maybe we will do that in time, for now below is a cheat sheet to help you if you want to use the Thrivent choice personal donation system

- 1. go to thrivent.com
- 2. search box type in "thrivent choice"
- 3. once in thrivent choice click on "make a personal donation"
- 4. follow remaining prompts which are self explanatory
