INTRODUCTION TO THE DAY

The archangel Michael is pictured as a prince and a general of the heavenly army, defeating the dragon (the ancient serpent, the devil, Satan). It is important, though, to see in Revelation 12:11 that God's victory ultimately comes by Jesus' death and the testimony of his followers. The power of God's truth gives us confidence in the face of evil on earth, even in the face of our own death.



Word

FIRST READING: DANIEL 10:10-14; 12:1-3

While set while Israel was in exile in Babylon, Daniel was probably written centuries later, during another time of defeat and suffering, under the Greeks. In both contexts, this passage offers assurance that the Jews are not abandoned by God, but are protected and will be vindicated by their "guardian angel," Michael.

¹⁰A hand touched me and roused me to my hands and knees. ¹¹He said to me, "Daniel, greatly beloved, pay attention to the words that I am going to speak to you. Stand on your feet, for I have now been sent to you." So while he was speaking this word to me, I stood up trembling. ¹²He said to me, "Do not fear, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your mind

to gain understanding and to humble yourself before your God, your words have been heard, and I have come because of your words. ¹³But the prince of the kingdom of Persia opposed me twenty-one days. So Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, and I left him there with the prince of the kingdom of Persia, ¹⁴and have come to help you understand what is to happen to your people at the end of days. For there is a further vision for those days.


¹²:1"At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. ²Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. ³Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."

PSALM 103

(Sung to the tune Raquel WOV 634)

It seems arrogant, and certainly superfluous, for humans to encourage angels to "bless the Lord," but the impulse comes from the overwhelming jubilation of the psalmist. "Bless," in this context, means "praise" rather than "bestow favor on," as when God is the one who is blessing.

SECOND READING: REVELATION 12:7-12


Like the book of Daniel, Revelation was written in a time of persecution to comfort the community. This passage describes the event also referred to in the Gospel reading. Michael has traditionally been seen as the archangel charged with fighting (especially to defend God's people), whereas Gabriel is charged with delivering messages.

⁷War broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels fought against the dragon. The dragon and his angels fought back, ⁸but they were defeated, and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. ⁹The great dragon was thrown down, that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world—he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.

10Then I heard a loud voice in heaven, proclaiming,
"Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Messiah,
for the accuser of our comrades has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God.
11But they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony,
for they did not cling to life even in the face of death.
12Rejoice then, you heavens and those who dwell in them!
But woe to the earth and the sea, for the devil has come down to you with great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!"

*Gospel Reading – Luke 10:17-20

After his Transfiguration and first passion prediction, Jesus had sent out 70 of his followers to proclaim the Gospel and heal, at which they were more successful than they had expected. While the event Jesus refers to might be Satan's failed attempt to tempt him at the beginning of his ministry, it is more likely to refer to the once and future cosmic defeat of the Father of Lies.



P: Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus has taught us



POSTLUDE

ABOUT TODAY'S FESTIVAL

A festival dedicated to the honor of the archangel Michael arose in the fifth century in Rome. Michael is not a saint, but in Jewish angelology one of the four archangels who carry out the will of God. The stories about Michael are war scenes, situating him within the final battle between good and evil. The focus of the day has broadened to include thanksgiving for all the angels, who are seen as messengers of the word and will of God.

HISTORY OF TODAY'S FESTIVAL WITH THE HARVEST

Because Michaelmas, an alternate name for today's feast, occurs near the fall equinox, medieval Britain tied this festival to agriculture and the turning of the seasons—making it a rich commemoration for contemporary farming communities. Just as Michael and the angels protect heaven from demons, they also protect human beings from famine and darkness.

As Christians celebrated the fall harvest, their religious services were peppered with prayers to Michael for courage and continued protection as the nights got longer and colder and they prepped food to survive the winter.

CONNECTING THE FESTIVAL WITH THE LITURGY

We sing the "Holy, holy" (*Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, p. 108), a.k.a. "The Sanctus," as we gather around God's presence in bread and wine. According to Isaiah 6:3 and Revelation 4:8, this song is the continuous praise of the angels.

Many Christians bow when singing the song of the angels because, as Isaiah depicts, the angels do not stare upon God. Christians rise and make the sign of the cross when singing the "Hosanna" because we are to remind ourselves that it is through Jesus that we may look at Divinity.

HARVEST HOME

In Protestant Germany, churches celebrate the harvest on the Sunday closest to September 29. This festival is known by various names. *Erntdankfest* (harvest thanks fest), *Erntfest* (harvest fest), sometimes *Erntfersammlung* (harvest gathering), "Aernkarrich" (harvest festival), and "Aernbreddich" (harvest thanksgiving). While German immigrants continued this celebration in North America, the name was replaced with the English term "Harvest Home."
