What's Blooming at Christ Church, October 8th, 2025 Sweet Alyssum, Lobularia maritima, which has been blooming for months in the Memorial Garden at the base of the flag pole, is most often grown as an annual. However, actually it is a short-lived perennial. The Sweet Alyssum growing at Christ Church has selfseeded and returned each year to bloom for over 15years. I give credit to Donna Eagles and Gladys Williams, as the gardeners who maintained the plantings around the church for many years for originally planting these long-blooming plants. Lobularia maritima is native to the Mediterranean. The tiny flowers bloom in clusters and emit a sweet, honey-like fragrance, attracting pollinators like bees and butterflies. The abundant flowers that bloom from spring to fall are available in varieties that have white, pink, or purple flowers. It makes an excellent floral groundcover, or can be used as a border plant. If planted among other annuals or perennials as a companion plant, its showy blooms and sweet scent make it useful to attract pollinators and beneficial insects. It forms a low-growing mound

which reaches 3-6 inches in height but can spread 12-14 inches or more. Lobularia prefers full sun but will tolerate partial shade. It thrives best in well drained, fertile soil, and once established is quite drought tolerant, which is the case of the conditions it is growing in at Christ Church. Sweet Alyssum can benefit from a light trimming when the initial blooms begin to fade, as this will encourage new flowers to form. The tight, free-flowering plants are also great for planters or hanging baskets as they will spill over the edge and create a more abundant appearance.

The genus name *Lobularia* comes from a Greek word meaning 'small pod,' referring to the shape of the fruits in other members of the genus. Interestingly the word *Alyssum* can be translated as 'lack of madness,' which is in reference to the historical use of the herb as a treatment against rabies. The species name *maritima* refers to its native coastal habitat.
