## Reflection

### **Usurpers & Insurrectionists**

The earliest external evidence we have of Christian practice comes from a letter from Pliny, a governor in what is now modern-day Turkey, to the Emperor Trajan (AD 110).

Pliny wrote to the emperor seeking guidance about how to deal with Christians, young and old, men and women, who were increasing in numbers, both in cities and country towns.

Christians were wrongly seen as usurpers and insurrectionists. Surely they would overturn Roman Law? Pliny tells us about ourselves:

They meet on a certain day (Sunday) before light where they gather and sing hymns to Christ as to a god.

They all bind themselves by oath, 'not to some crimes, says Pliny. Rather, they pledge not to commit any crimes such as fraud, theft, or adultery, and subsequently share a meal of 'ordinary and innocent food' (Eucharist).

What hymns might they have sung? Look no further than 2 Timothy 2:

If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him.

If we disown him, then he will disown us.

We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, For he cannot disown his own self.

Amen.
