September often feels like a turning point. Summer fades, school starts back, routines shift, and the pace of life seems to pick up. In many ways, it's a season of transition—of finding new rhythms after the looseness of summer. As a church, we're stepping into a new rhythm too: for the next several months, our worship will be shaped by the lectionary.

You may be wondering: What is the lectionary, and why are we using it?

The lectionary is a schedule of Scripture readings followed by churches all around the world. It typically includes four passages each week—a reading from the Old Testament, a Psalm, a Gospel, and a New Testament letter—designed to guide us through the major themes of the Bible over the course of the church year. These readings align with the seasons of the Christian calendar (Advent, Lent, Easter, etc.) and help connect our worship to a broader, deeper story than just our own.

But beyond simply being a reading plan, the lectionary offers something we all deeply need right now: a rhythm.

In a world that often feels unpredictable, fast paced, and scattered, the lectionary invites us to slow down and dwell in the Scriptures alongside others across time and space. It helps center us—not just on what we feel like hearing, but on the fullness of Scripture, even the parts we might otherwise skip. It shapes our faith not just week to week, but season by season, forming us over time into people who are rooted, attentive, and spiritually grounded.

As we step into this lectionary rhythm together, I invite you to think of it as more than a list of readings. Think of it as a practice of listening—to God, to Scripture, and to one another. Think of it as a way to mark time differently, not just by our calendars or to-do lists, but by the movements of grace, challenge, hope, and renewal that Scripture offers.

As we move into fall, what rhythms are shaping your life? In this season of shifting schedules and new beginnings, it's a natural time to reassess what grounds us, what feeds us, and what brings us closer to God. Maybe it's setting aside a few quiet moments each morning to reflect on the weekly readings. Maybe it's carving out time for prayer or joining a small group. Or maybe it's simply committing to being more present in worship each week, knowing
