Our Ministries

AUDIO VISUAL TECHNOLOGY: Paul Bourgeois

The screen ministry enhances the visual experience in worship using the Sanctuary screens. This ministry supports the music and worship by appropriate volume levels ensuring minimizing feedback and other disruptions. People working the soundboard need to arrive at least 20 minutes before the service to set up lapel and hand-held mic as necessary and to set the sound level for the pre-service music. Throughout the service, it is important to anticipate the need to turn mics on and off and to adjust volumes. The board is labeled to make this job easier and firsttimers will work with veterans during the service to become familiar with the board's operation. This ministry is not only required for Sunday services but also for other services such as weddings and funerals and other occasional special events.


