INTRODUCTION TO THE DAY

The feast of Epiphany ("manifestation") concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God's glory revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. In Isaiah and Ephesians, that glory is proclaimed for all nations and people. Like the light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God who are claimed and washed in the waters of baptism. We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God's love to all people.







WORD

FIRST READING: ISAIAH 60:1-6

As Jeremiah and Ezekiel had promised, God brought the Israelites back home to Jerusalem from their exile in Jerusalem. This rescue, unlikely and unexpected, was itself an Epiphany: an awe-inspiring appearance of God within human affairs to rescue and redeem.

 Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you.
 For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you.
 Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

⁴Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms.
⁵Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you.
⁶A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah;

PSALM 72: 1-7, 10-15



Like Isaiah the psalmist presents God's blessing (here of the king at his coronation) as a matter of international significance.





The people will flourish like mountains around, And righteousness like fruit from hills will abound. For he will defend all the needy and save 'their children; put those who oppress in the grave.

And he will endure for as long as the sun; As long as the moon—through all ages that run. He'll be like the rain falling on a mown field; Like showers that water the earth, fruit to yield.

In his days the righteous will flourish, stand sure, Abundance abound till the moon is no more. The great kings of Tarshish and of distant shores will bring to him tribute of great precious ores.

The kings of both Sheba and Seba are there, Presenting him gifts of their kingdoms most fair. All kings of the earth will bow down to his fame; All nations will serve him and honor his name.

For he will deliver the needy who cry; He'll help the afflicted when no one is nigh. He will take great pity on both poor and weak; The needy near death, he will save and will seek.

He'll rescue them from great oppression and might, For their blood is precious and dear in his sight. O long may he live! Sheba's gold pave his way; Let people pray for him and bless him all day.

SECOND READING: EPHESIANS 3:1-12

It was easy in the early church to consider Gentile Christians to be less legitimate than their Jewish siblings. Many of the New Testament writers preached against this, including the author of Ephesians in this passage. Indeed, today's Gospel reading, of Gentiles adoring Christ, may be told exactly for the same purpose.

¹This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles—
²for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, ³and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, ⁴a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. ⁵In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: ⁶that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

⁷Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. ⁸Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; ¹⁰so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. ¹¹This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹²in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.

*GOSPEL READING: MATTHEW 2:1-12

Since the Easter season ended last spring, we have been reading through the stories in Matthew's Gospel of Jesus's earthly ministry, from his call of the disciples to the beginning of the Passion. This parable is his final one. It provides still another perspective on Matthew's great theme – that Jesus is Immanuel, "God with us" – which began with his nativity story and will continue until Jesus' promise at the end of the book: "I am with you to the close of the age."

P: The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew, the second chapter.

A: Glory to you, O Lord.

¹In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ²asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." ³When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

⁶'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;


for from you shall come a ruler

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

⁷Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. ⁸Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." ⁹When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. ¹¹On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

INVITATION TO BAPTISM

*NICENE CREED

L: As the magi offered gifts to the Christ child, empower us to give generously. Prosper the work of ministry partnerships in our community (*especially*). Together, help us share what we have to ensure that our neighbors have enough food, resources, and opportunities. Hear us, O God. **A: Your mercy is great.**

Here other intercessions may be offered.

L: You have redeemed the lives of your faithful departed. Through the love of Christ, gather us into one body with them, especially the saints of our congregation who have gone before us like Becky Nordberg, Bill Keller, Jean Knepper, Mike Shoemaker, and Royal Kline Jr. Reveal to us the mystery hidden for ages in the One who created all things. Hear us, O God. **A:** Your mercy is great.

L: Abide with us, O God of mercy, and receive our prayers according to your abundant grace. **A: Amen.**








*PREFACE




