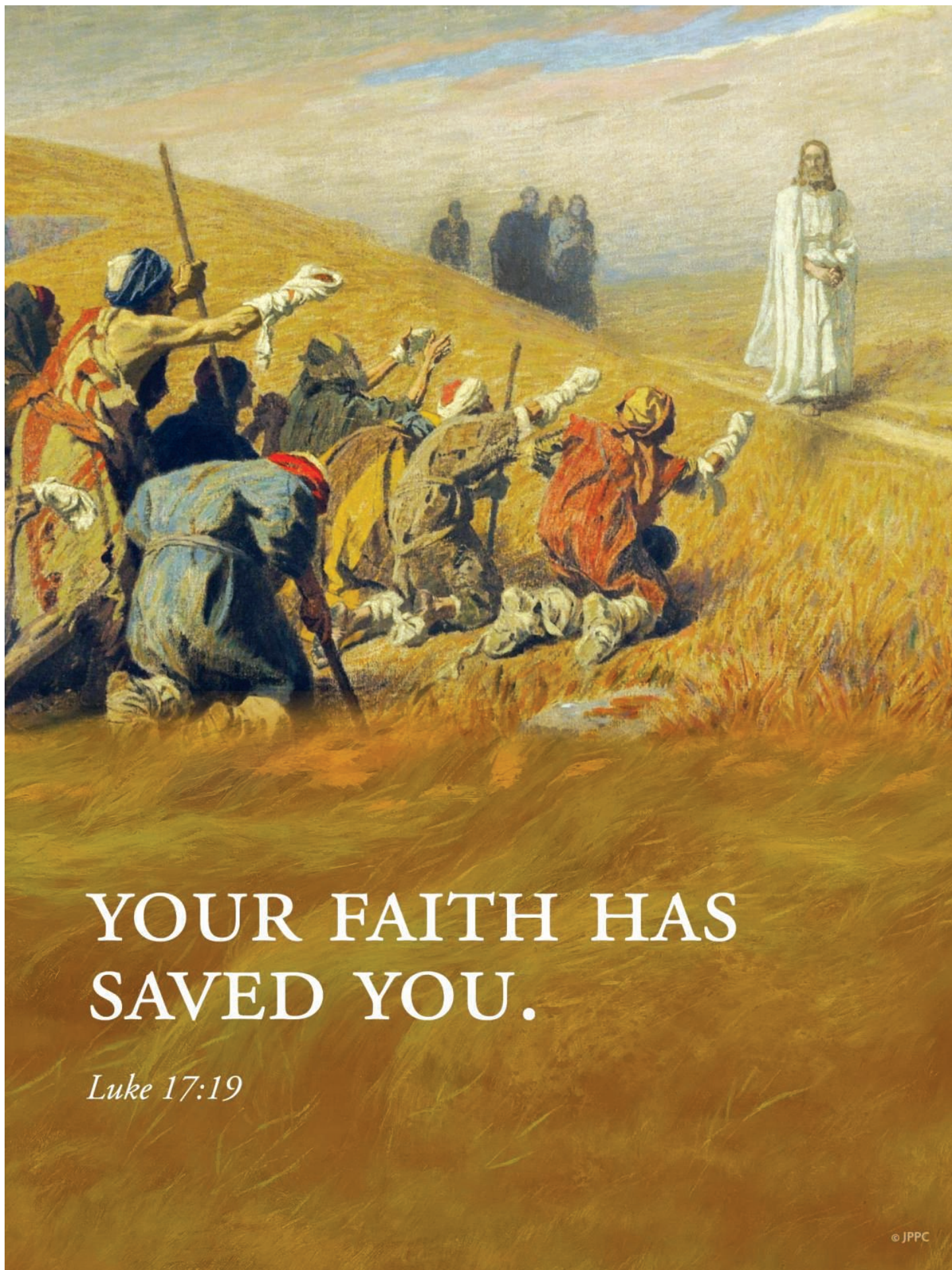

SPN Parish Council Holy Moment Thought... "FINDING GOD"

"Whoever finds God, finds everything; whoever loses God loses everything."
(St Robert Bellarmine, Bishop and Doctor of the Church)

"When a large crowd gathered, with people from one town after another journeying to Jesus, he spoke in a parable. A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path and was trampled, and the birds of the sky ate it up. Some seed fell on rocky ground, and when it grew, it withered for lack of moisture. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some seed fell on good soil, and when it grew, it produced fruit a hundredfold. After saying this, he called out, "Whoever has ears to hear ought to hear." (Luke 8: 4-8).

The seed is the Word of God. The seed that fell on the path may be likened to those living today in western societies. Unbridled affluence and materialism have eroded the faith of Our Fathers. People hear the Gospel and let it be trampled underfoot, the cares of daily life eat up this trampled seed. The Gospel message falls on rocky soil and withers when we hear the Word on Sundays only and have no prayer life to water and soften our rocky hearts. And when we begin to understand God's Word, we often allow the pettiness of squabbles, the pain of past hurts or pride or power to be the thorns which choke out our real ability to grow in the Word.

Sometimes, we hear the Word and prefer to be hearers only and not doers. Our ever merciful Savior continues to sow the Word every day through the Sacred Scriptures, teachings from Sacred Tradition and the Magisterium. How do we nurture a hundredfold production of our faith? You, too, are a sower of the Word whether you are a parent, teacher, catechist, evangelist, nurse, politician, garbage collector, etc. Whatever you are or do, the Lord has entrusted you to partner with Him to transform the world today. How do you respond?

Please consider saying the following prayer...Lord Jesus, you have chosen me to be your disciple. Please help me to fulfill your calling. Take and use what I can offer, however meager it may seem, for the greater glory of your name. Amen
