## Special Offering this Sunday: WeCan Shelter Society

Each Thanksgiving, the Social Justice Committee asks the congregation to give a special offering to a local charity. This year, our special offerings will go to **WeCan Shelter Society**, an organization that was founded in 2019 by Charlene Davis in order to create affordable housing. Each home built by WeCan contains a small kitchen with sink, fridge and breakfast bar eating area, a toilet, shower, small closet and sleeping area along with an outside covered deck to extend the living area. There are now 15 finished



homes at the Maple Pool Campground in Courtenay and they are working on number 16.

This Sunday, Charlene will join us and briefly speak about the WeCan Shelter Society. She will also be available after worship during coffee time to answer any questions you might have.

It costs around \$30,000 to build a Tiny Home. Your donation will help to build one and give one more person the warmth, security and dignity of having a home.
