

Pastor's Page

A few Sunday ago I began my sermon with this question: I do not have enough..... How would you answer it? Top answers that Sunday were: time, money, energy, wisdom, courage, patience and faith (see the worship livestream from Sunday, October 5th if you want to hear the rest of the sermon). Often times it does not feel like we have enough. But the consistent message of the Bible is that God has given us enough. And more deeply that we are ourselves enough.

Soon the church Discipleship Team will be sending out its annual pledge cards for the 2026 financial year. Each year we ask the members and friends of this church to support the mission of this church with their financial gifts. It is always a struggle. For the past several years we have ended the year with less than \$1000 in the checking account just barely enough. This year we face two more challenges. We all know things cost more. We have also lost some of the saints of this church whose very generous financial giving has supported so much of what we do here at First Congregational Church.

This year more than perhaps ever before, we need you to do three things.

- First, if you don't pledge, please start this year.
- Second, if you do pledge, please increase your pledge, even if only slightly.
- Third, work toward a tithe recognizing all the ways God has blessed you and our call to share those blessings with others.



Art Exhibit

The exhibit *Cardboard Chronicles: The Biblical Art of Rudolph Bostic* is on display in the Fellowship Hall. The exhibit features 20 original paintings depicting biblical stories. Bostic's work appears in folk art museums and galleries in the United States, including in the Smithsonian Museum in Washington, DC.

Bostic is a self-taught artist. As a teenager he worked in a bakery and realized the smooth cardboard baking supplies were delivered in would make suitable canvases for his work. For his whole painting career, Bostic used cardboard and whatever paint was available to him—typically house paint, acrylic paint, black markers, and glitter. Bostic is known for his use of vibrant color, his visually complex scenes, the painted cardboard borders that frame his work, and his fascination with angels.

Bostic commented, "I love angels. I believe angels are behind most of what happens on this earth, working for the forces of light. There are guardian angels and angels who oversee the weather. God has given each angel a specific job to do."

What keeps you coming back to First Congregational? The ministry and the people. Every time we enter our church, it feels like we are coming home.



Church Angels

Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.". Hebrews 13:2

So much of the work of the church goes on almost invisibly. We all know of those who teach and sing and usher and welcome and serve, but there are also angels among us who do

things behind the scenes that few know about. Taking our cue from the scripture verse above, we will try to draw attention to some of these unsung angels among us.

By now most of us know about the Among Friends program for families with dementia that offers respite care each Tuesday and Thursday (and if not, check out their great Facebook and webpage!). This amazing program would not have happened without the faithful and loving leadership of two if its founders — Norma Revels and Bonnie Jones-Witthuhn. Begun in 2017 out of a local needs assessment by our church Mission Team, Among Friends has grown and thrived.

Just today 20 people, guests and volunteers, gathered for chair yoga and coffee, Word of the Day and walks around the block, puzzles and games, crafts and homemade lunches, mini golf and cribbage, poetry and painting projects and so much more. None of this would be here if it were not for the leadership shown by Bonnie and Norma. Bonnie is a retired pastor and high school English teacher. Norma is a retired social worker. They helped steer the program from its launch, through Covid, expansion from one to two days a week, and most recently through the sudden loss of its director.

Norma and Bonnie are the first to admit this program is needed, valued and takes place through the work of so many faithful volunteers. Yet it is also true that these two have gone above and beyond to make it into the thriving program it is today. Please thank them for being church angels. And pray for a new director to be selected soon!

Next Learning Community: Exploring Polarization

The next Learning Community event will be **Tuesday, November 25, 6:30 pm.** The conversation will explore polarization.

American legislatures are more polarized today than at any moment in the past half-century, and there is little end in sight. Two important questions are: Why are American legislatures so polarized? And what policies might help bridge this growing ideological gulf? In the upcoming Learning Community event, Andy Myers (congregation member and Stanford PhD candidate in Political Economics) will present his ongoing research that helps address these questions, focusing on campaign finance, local press coverage, election administration, and candidate supply.

It is possible to allow fear and impressions to dominate one's understanding of issues. This presentation will be a nonpartisan conversation focused on data-driven evidence to help people understand important issues of the day. Please come!

Empty Pill Bottles (Prescription Only)




River Falls Food Pantry
