


Jacket Racket will run from October 21 to November 1 this year!

Grief affects each one of us at some time in our lives. To accompany one another along the way is a true gift of grace that requires practicing compassion and sacred presence.







The September 21st service saw twenty people join Julia as she continued her services about change and transformation.

We heard two small parables from Matthew 13:44-45 and Julia's



essential source everything comes from. Later in the message we were asked to come and pour our glass of water back into the larger bowl of water. Thus demonstrating that we all have within us the living water of life. We are spiritual beings having human experiences. Jesus tells us that the kin-dom of God resides within us and that we are the breath of God - the water of life.

September 28th worship service saw twenty-one people join Julia for the conclusion of her Change series. We heard the scripture 1 John 1:5-10 which speaks of sin. Julia's message was entitled "Clean It Up, then Let It Go!" We often do not like to be vulnerable. We also do not like to admit our mistakes. However, when we hold onto things we become sick as we often do not know how to forgive ourselves. And if we cannot confess what we are doing sin continues. Sin is against what is right and moral and is an offense against God. Let us confess to ourselves and another person and seek forgiveness. Confession is a human need and forgiveness remains powerful. What within our lives requires confession and forgiveness?

On World Communion Sunday, October 5th, twenty-three people joined Julia for worship. We heard from the scripture Ephesians 4:15-24 and Julia's message was entitled "What in the World?" This Sunday began the new theme of Sustaining Growth. In North America society is becoming more secular and we do not speak about religion as much as we used to. We are still called to love one another and remain rooted and grounded in community. For we cannot really call ourselves Christian - followers of Christ - without community. So as we prepared to share in our communion meal together we were asked to consider the question, 'are you/we all in for love?' How do we as individuals and as part of community answer this question?

At the Power Social following the service we celebrated those in our community whose birthdays are in July, August, September, and October. From this point forward, we will celebrate birthdays on the first Sunday of each month.
