## Message from Pastor Jeff

Since 2020, we have collected almost \$100,000 in food for the Community Services Clearinghouse through our "Feeding a Multitude"



Sunday when we give the church family envelopes with \$25 cash (the total amount we give out is \$5000.) We began this during the covid era when it was impossible for our community partners to buy in bulk. So we went out as individuals and each bought a little that turned into a lot. God multiplied that \$5000 in such a beautiful way that first year that we decided to make it an annual event.

Each year it is fun to watch our \$5000 investment grow into a harvest of close to \$25,000 in food for those who are in need. This Sunday is our "Feeding a Multitude" Sunday, and I encourage you to take an envelope and to purchase some non-perishable food items. Return them to the church any time next week. The Community Services Clearinghouse truck will be here to receive your items until Monday, October 27. Last year we filled the truck up three times!

We are going to have a choir for our 9:30am and 11:00am services on Sunday, December 21, and we would love for you to be a part of it. 



#### Seasonal Depression Support Group Starts Monday, October 20, 7-8:30pm Limited Registration to 10 Persons

Many of us are impacted by the seasonal changes in a variety of ways. For some of us, there can be a

noticeable change in our mood and energy as we move from summer to fall, and winter. Oftentimes this condition can be known as Seasonal Depressive Disorder or Seasonal Affective Disorder. It is more than just the "winter blues" and there can be numerous causes.

For some of us, it may not be the change in the season but the difficulty of the holidays. Holiday struggles due to relational challenges, difficult memories, or the loss of someone that we love are real and impactful to many.

As a church community, it's important that we remember those who struggle during this season. Compassion, prayer, and simple acts of connection—like a phone call, a walk together, or an invitation to fellowship—can make a real difference. Most importantly, there is hope and help available through our Mental Health Ministry.

I will be leading an 8 week group designed to assist in combating seasonal depression difficulties. This space will be designed to provide a safe space to find support, processing of your experience and maintain meaningful connections during this time.

The group will be on Monday evenings, starting on October 20 from 7 - 8:30 pm. This is a closed group, meaning that once all of the spots are filled, additional members will not be admitted. There are 10 spots available. If you would like to be part of this group, please sign up **HERE**.

If you have struggled with significant changes in mood and energy, or are challenged by grief during this time of year, please consider joining us and being lifted up by your brothers and sisters in Christ.
