Sermon



The Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through whom all things were made. Who, for us and for our salvation came down from heaven: who by the power of the Holy Spirit became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made human. Who for our sake was crucified under Pontius Pilate; who suffered death and was buried. Who, on the third day, rose again in accordance with the scriptures; who ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. Who will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and whose kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. Who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified. Who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Stewardship of our Hearts

Stewardship is just a fancy word meaning taking responsibility of the things that are important to us. Over the stewardship season we will explore stewardship of a variety of things in our lives.

Our spiritual ancestors called the centre of our being *our hearts*, or even sometimes, *our guts*.

Our hearts are the inner parts of our lives where we develop things like **faith** and **hope**. It is the place where God's Spirit nourishes **joy**, **peace**, **patience**, **kindness**, **goodness**, **gentleness**, **faithfulness** and **self-control**. But above all our heart is where we develop the foundational Christian practice of **love**.

All of these things take time to nourish and develop. And if we don't steward our heart, they will never grow.

This week, let's consider how to steward our heart.

First, do a heart check-up. Are you feeling anxious, afraid, angry? Do you find yourself snapping at the people you love? Are you losing hope in the future? Or is everything fine? Make a list of the things that concern you and the things that give your delight.

Second, feed your heart. Fill your heart with things that will nourish joy and wonder. Fast from things that raise your levels of anxiety. Read a good book. Listen to your favourite song. Spend time with a dear friend.

Remember, the world needs God's Children to steward their hearts well!
