

THE RECTOR'S CORNER

In today's Gospel, a scribe asked the Lord Jesus, "Which is the first commandment of all?" That was a big question because according to tradition, there were 613 commandments within the Law of Moses, and these are in addition to the Ten Commandments! How in the world could one of these be singled out as the first, above the others?

Jesus told the man that above everything else, we must love the Lord our God with our all: all our heart, all our soul, all our mind, and all our strength. If the scribe was looking for a 'pat' answer – something defined and measurable, he didn't get it. Jesus said, 'give your all', no limits.

What Jesus highlighted is the fact that the Christian Faith is not about rules. It is not a contract; it is not about doing this or that, to earn God's favour. God has extended His favour – His grace -- to us freely, through His Son, Jesus Christ.

The Christian Faith is about relationship – our relationship with Christ. It is only because of Jesus that we can be reconciled to God. He gave His all for us at the Cross. As St. Paul said in today's Epistle, "In every way, you are enriched by Him." And we are. Therefore, let us offer Him our 'all'.
