I would suggest, though, that compassion animates the Jewish purity system; it was a protective and benevolent system intended to preserve God's presence among his people, a presence that could be of considerable danger to humans if they approached God wrongly.

Access to sacred space was heavily restricted, not out of a lack of compassion but out of the belief that this <u>holy God</u> not only was merciful and loving but also was a powerful force that could be dangerous.



In the Gospel Jesus deals with the ritual impurity that represents death (lepra, discharges, corpses)... before dealing with humanity's moral impurity that represents eternal death.

He overcomes death through his own death and resurrection, bringing life to all, who believe.
