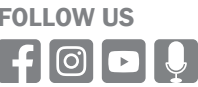

TELL ME THE STORIES OF JESUS Good Next Steps: Home-Group Study and/or Personal Discipleship Guide	Luke 10:25-37
Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week! Start with <u>Prayer</u> -ask Jesus to guide our time together. Review prayer requests. <u>Read the Text</u> – Luke 10:25-37 <u>Questions for Reflection and Discussion:</u> 1. Why did the expert in religious law come to Jesus, what was he intended to do? What do his questions reveal about his presuppositions regarding both eternal life and loving one’s neighbor? 2. What are some of the things happening inside of our hearts and minds when we feel the need to justify ourselves? What might we be thinking or feeling that would lead us into self-justification? 3. The expert in religious law wants Jesus to draw lines and define terms for him, what does Jesus do instead? How does the parable get to the heart of the matter? 4. What was the failure of the priest and Levite? Why is the presence of a “good” Samaritan so scandalous? How do we know when we have deeply seen another person in need? 5. Take time to reflect on, journal about and discuss the Christ-centric reading, where Jesus is in the position of the Good Samaritan and we are all the man beaten and left for dead along the side of the road. 6. What are your takeaways, or how have you been challenged through our study in this parable? What would application of this text look like in your life this week? <u>Questions guiding Spiritual Formation & Application:</u> 1. How does this text invite us to grow in a greater love for God? 2. What lessons within this text move us towards growing in our love for one another? 3. What principles could be applied to our family life, careers, communities, or congregational life? 4. Consider how Jesus could use our application of the principles in this text to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
