WE ARE AT 53% OF OUR \$420,000 GOAL

Thank you to those of you that have pledged. To date we have received 42 pledges totaling \$231,260 with an average pledge of \$5,506 and a median pledge of \$4,800. We have also seen a 28% increase in overall pledge levels over last year. This is terrific news, and we are grateful. However, we are still \$188,740 short of our goal for 2026. 42 households that made pledges in 2025 have not yet submitted a pledge for 2026. We need everyone to make a commitment to support our wonderful St. Luke's community. Without everyone's support, we may not be able to meet our ongoing financial obligations and daily operating costs (and will be unable to provide

any new support/services). Without pledges, we cannot develop a budget and plan for the work of serving God and the world through our missions and ministries. Please make every effort to submit your pledge by November 1st.
